

Nancy De Briyne studied veterinary medicine in Ghent (Belgium), graduating in 1996. After working as a veterinary practitioner in Belgium and the UK, she works since 2000 for the Federation of Veterinarians of Europe (FVE).

Within FVE she is specifically responsible for dossiers in field of veterinary medicines, animal welfare, education and communication. Presently, she is Deputy Executive Director of the FVE.

In respect to medicines, she published papers on factors influencing prescription behaviour, antibiotic sensitivity testing, antibiotics most commonly prescribed for animals, alternatives to antibiotic treatments and adverse events of medicines. She is member of the Management Board of the European Medicines Agency representing the veterinary profession.

In respect to animal welfare, in 2015, she became diplomate of the European College of Animal Welfare and Behavioural medicine, subspecialty Animal Welfare Science, Ethics and Law. She has worked extensively in the field of transport of animals (being core partner in the EU Animal Transport Guides Project), pig welfare (pig castration, tail docking), cattle welfare, companion animal welfare and animal welfare science, ethics and law teaching in veterinary education. She is member of the EU Platform on Animal Welfare and EFSA hearing export on the transport of animals.
