Public hearing on the "Recommendations for the future" (see documents here)

Five experts participated: **Dr Jed Goodfellow**, Lecturer and PhD in Animal Law at Macquarie University (Australia); **Mr Giuliano Marchesin**, Director of OI INTERCARNEITALIA (Italy); **Mr Miguel Angel Higuera**, Chair of COPA-COGECA's Animal Health and Welfare Working Party (Spain); **Ms Anne Garreta and Ms Marie-Noëlle Orain**, Rapporteurs on Animal Welfare at the French Economic, Social and Environmental Council (France).

Their presentations were followed by an exchange of views with Members.

State of play on on-going negotiations and considerations of amendments: (documents available here)

Members participated in an exchange of view, with the co-rapporteurs <u>Daniel Buda</u> (EPP) and <u>Isabel Carvalhais</u> (S&D). ANIT Members tabled 1233 amendments and the co-rapporteurs together with representatives of other political groups (shadow rapporteurs) try to strike compromises before the ANIT committee vote in December. The co-rapporteurs provided the ANIT committee with feedback from meetings with shadow rapporteurs that have taken place so far.

# Exchange of views with the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) on ongoing work

The Committee on Protection of Animals during Transport held an exchange of view with **Mr Nikolaus Križ**, Head of Animal Health and Welfare Unit, and **Mr Ernesto Liebana Criado**, Head of Biological Hazards and Contaminants Unit, following the mandate received from the Commission last June. The focus was on the work developed so far on the scientific opinions concerning Animal Welfare during transport and the transmission of Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) during animal transport.
