

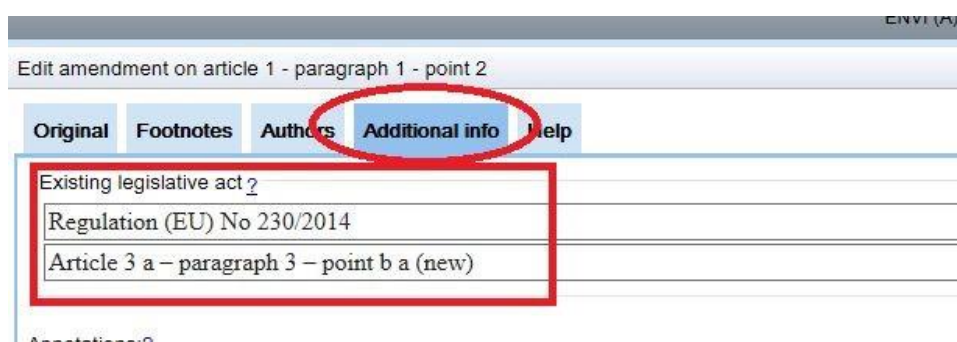
1. How can I amend a provision of the basic act which is part of the Commission proposal (for an amending act)?

Please edit the provision of the basic act (the act to be amended) included in the Commission proposal, which you would like to amend, and make the necessary changes, as follows:

(3) In Article 7, paragraph (1) is replaced by the following:



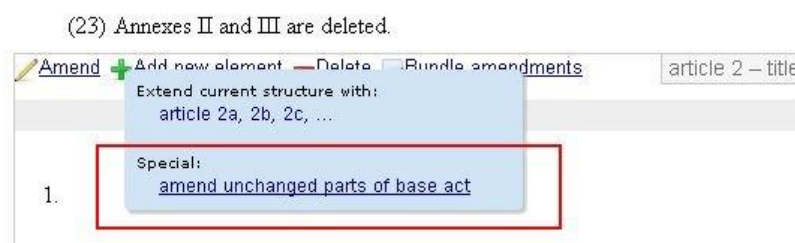
Before saving the amendment, please don't forget to add the references to the basic act in "Additional info".



2. How can I create an amendment to an amending act which concerns a provision of the basic act (the act to be amended) which the Commission proposal does not seek to amend?

Go to the right place in the COM proposal where such an amendment should be created.

Select the option "amend unchanged part of the basic act" available under "Add new element".



A two-steps interface will open. In the first step, insert the original text (from an outside source, usually from Eurlex) and the appropriate reference. In the second step, make your amendment as for a standard amendment.

Step 1: insert the original text and copy/paste the url address from Eurlex or enter the CELEX reference number.

Introduce an amendment on unchanged parts of base act - Step 1

1 Paste (Ctrl + V) the original text from base act

2 Edit the pasted text and create the amendment

Member States may derogate from the first paragraph of Article 9, the first sentence of point (a) of Article 21(1) and Articles 29, 30 and 33 to the extent that such derogations are necessary for the adoption or application of provisions designed to encourage the participation of employees, or other groups of persons defined by national law, in the capital of undertakings.

Use this window to present amendments on elements that were not originally changed in the proposal. Start with copy-pasting the original text as it stands in the base act.

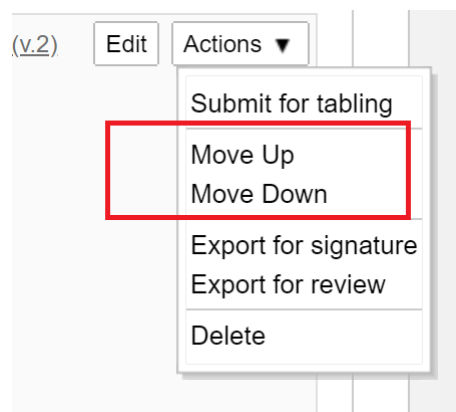

Step 2: edit the pasted text and create the amendment.

Don't forget to add the introductory part in the right-hand column and the reference to the basic act in "Additional info".

3. How can I move an amendment which was created in the wrong place?

1) You can move amendments up and down using the relevant option available in "Actions".



However, this option is rather limited as it allows you to move the amendments within a family of provisions. This means that you will not be able to move an amendment e.g. from the enacting part to recitals.

2) Relocation:

The 'relocate' function allows to move the amendments around in a more flexible way than the 'move up' and 'move down' function. However, this function is only available to the committee secretariats.

In the example below a new point (ba) has been created in paragraph 4 of Article 8, whereas that amendment should have been created as a new paragraph (2a) of Article 6.






