1. ADOPTION OF DRAFT AGENDA

The draft agenda was adopted in the form shown in the minutes.

2. CHAIR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

3. DECISIONS ON URGENT MATTERS

3.1 *Review of the procedure for the treatment of the two Brexit-related proposals on medicinal*

Decision taken: *Coordinators decided to request the application of the urgent procedure (Rule 163 RoP) for the two proposals, in view of a quick adoption in plenary and mandated the chair to send a letter with such a request to the President.*

3.2 Request for a delegation to the World Health Assembly in Geneva (22 to 29 of May)

Decision taken: *Coordinators decided to request authorisation for sending an ENVI delegation (3 days) to the 75th World Health Assembly, composed of 3 Members, including the EP rapporteur on cross-border health threats. They also decided to invite the Commission for an exchange views in ENVI in May, inter alia, to discuss the EU position at the upcoming 75th World Health Assembly, and the progress made on the draft Pandemics Treaty.*

3.3. Update on the ENVI request for mission to IMO MEPC 78 meeting

Decision taken: *Coordinators decided to request authorisation for sending a three-day (including travel) delegation composed of three ENVI Members to the IMO MEPC 78.*

3.4 EP ad-hoc delegation to the High Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development, July 2022, UN Headquarters, New York

Decision taken:: *Coordinators mandated the Chair to write a letter jointly with the DEVE chair to the President to request a 10-Member ad-hoc delegation to the HLPF in New York from 13 to 15 July (excluding travel).*

3.5 EP ad-hoc delegation to COP27 on Climate Change, Sharm El-Sheikh, Egypt

Decision taken:

- A.** *Coordinators mandated the Chair to write a letter jointly with the ITRE Chair to the Conference of Presidents in order to request an authorisation for sending a 15-Member ad-hoc EP delegation to the high-level segment of the COP27 Climate Change Conference in Sharm El-Sheikh. The 15 Members are to be nominated by the political groups in accordance with the rolling d'Hondt system, which shall also apply to the non-attached Members. The coordinators declined the request by the DEVE chair to co-sign the request for the ad-hoc EP delegation.*
- B.** *Coordinators decided to request the Policy Department to commission a study on the issues at stake in view of the COP27.*
- C.** *Coordinators also decided that ENVI, as the Committee responsible for climate change shall prepare, pursuant to Rule 136 of the Rules of Procedure, Oral Questions to the*

Council and the Commission as well as a motion for resolution in order to define Parliament's position ahead of COP27. The resolution should be adopted prior to COP27 in plenary in October 2022 at the latest. It might include contributions from other interested Committees in line with their competences, in particular ITRE and DEVE, as has been the case for previous COPs. Political groups are invited inform the secretariat by 30 March of the name of their nominated co-sponsor.

3.6 Committee programming activities for the 2nd semester 2022

3.6.1. Missions to agencies, to EU and candidate countries and ad-hoc delegations outside the EU

Decision taken: *Coordinators confirmed the visits to ECHA and EEA during the turquoise weeks (detailed dates to be decided at a later stage). They also took note that the delegation to EFSA would take place during the May 2021 turquoise week.*

Decision taken: *Coordinators decided to include the following delegations in their programming activities for the 2nd semester 2022:*

- *IMO MEPC 79 (3 Members - three days including travel),*
- *CITES COP19 (3 Members - dates to be determined)*

3.6.2 Other activities (public hearings, activities with national parliaments)

Decision taken: *Coordinators mandated the Chair to inform the CCC that authorisation for Public Hearings will be requested, if necessary, on an ad-hoc individual basis and that no activities with National Parliaments are foreseen for the second half of 2022.*

3.7 Handling of activities of the PETI committee in ENVI remit

Decision taken: *Coordinators had an exchange of views on how to deal with PETI activities within ENVI remit and mandated the Chair to raise the issue with his PETI counterpart to ensure that ENVI is notified about short motions for resolution and other PETI activities that touch upon ENVI competences. In this context, they mandated the chair to request clarifications on the status of the PETI study called “report on the harmonisation of EU environmental law” to avoid misrepresentations of official EP positions.*

Furthermore, coordinators mandated the Chair to raise the issue in the framework of the CCC and with the AFCO chair in view of the ongoing work on the revision of the Rules of Procedure.

3.8 Relations with other committees

** Update on AGRI resolution on protection of livestock farming and wolves*

Decision taken: *Coordinators took note of the latest developments.*

** ITRE contestation of referral of methane legislative proposal to ENVI*

Decision taken: *Coordinators decided to mandate the Chair to contact his ITRE counterpart in order to agree on a joint committee procedure (Rule 58) and to inform the CCC Chair accordingly, if an agreement is found.*

** AGRI letter to Commissioner for Agriculture on food security concerns during the Russian - Ukrainian armed conflict*

Decision taken: *Coordinators discussed on the impacts of the armed conflict on sustainable food systems and mandated the chair to send a letter to Executive Vice-President Timmermans on the impact of the Russian – Ukrainian armed conflict and the need for resilient and independent food systems.
The coordinators also mandated the chair to contact his counterparts in AGRI and DEVE to propose a joint hearing on this topic.*

In this context, they decided to invite DG ENER and DG CLIMA to an exchange of views on the Commission's Communication "REPowerEU: Joint European Action for more affordable, secure and sustainable energy".*

Coordinators underlined the importance of ensuring a coherent position in ENVI on the Fit for 2030 package and mandated therefore the secretariat to identify possible overlaps and contradictions between files. Coordinators will revert back to the issue, when necessary.

Coordinators reiterated their concerns on the problems related to the interpretation of shadow meetings and decided, that in view of the exceptional workload, to request interpretation only when necessary, and to revert back to the issue, if necessary.
