





Why did we do this audit?

Condition of EU forests is deteriorating


Conservation status of forests by region as of 2018

- the impact of the Commission's action in a number of key environmental and climate policies and

Period covered: 2014 - 2020





Illegal logging still occurs

- ➤ The number of checks on domestic operators: low
- >The quality of checks: not analysed
- ➤ The definitions of illegal logging: may differ among MS

Remote sensing:

> great potentials, but not used consistently

The forestry measures:
no significant improvement in biodiversity and tackling climate change

- Financial support to forestry (EAFRD): only3 % of all rural development spending
- ➤ Forest management plans: no significant contribution to environmentally sustainable activities
- ➤ Rural development measures: little impact on forest biodiversity and resilience to climate change
- ➤ The common EU monitoring system: not measuring the biodiversity and climate change effects of forestry measures



What do we recommend (1)?

RECOMMENDATION 1

Improving the contribution to biodiversity and tackling climate change in forests by 2023

The Commission should draw up and apply an action plan to:

- > review the adoption and application of forest conservation measures;
- > collect and disseminate knowledge amongst Member States on adapting forests to climate change.







What do we recommend (2)?

RECOMMENDATION 2

Strengthening the fight against illegal logging by 2023

The Commission should:

- assess the potential for making legislative proposals to improve review of Member State checks on the Timber Regulation;
- > extend and promote use of geospatial intelligence.





What do we recommend (3)?

RECOMMENDATION 3

Better focusing rural development forestry measures on biodiversity and climate change by 2023

The Commission should ensure that:

- only sustainable forest management actions are supported;
- > relevant information to assess the contribution of EU funded forestry measures to biodiversity and climate change mitigation and adaptation in forests are available.
