Coordinators' decisions and recommendations

1. DEVE and the rollout of vaccines in developing countries

Decision: Organise a meeting between DEVE Coordinators and Commissioner Urpilainen on the rollout of vaccines in developing countries

2. Possible appointment of rapporteurs and rapporteurs for opinion

Non-legislative reports

Coordinators agreed on the following list of own-initiatives reports:

- 1) The new orientation of EU humanitarian actions (attributed to S&D Standing Rapporteur on humanitarian assistance for two points)
- 2) Addressing food security in developing countries (attributed to ECR for two points)
- 3) The future European Financial Architecture for Development (attributed to RENEW for two points)
- 4) Policy Coherence for Development (attributed to the PCD Standing Rapporteur for two points)

Legislative Opinions

• Non legislative opinions:

(i) 'The persecution of minorities on the grounds of belief or religion'

Draft an opinion (attributed to EPP for one point)

ii) Draft Recommendation to the Council taking stock of the functioning of the EEAS and for a stronger EU in the world

DEVE contribution to take the form of a letter from DEVE Chair to the AFET Chair

iii) Recommendation to the Council on corruption and human rights

DEVE contribution to take the form of a letter from DEVE Chair to the AFET Chair

iv) DEVE contribution to ENVI motion for a resolution on climate COP 26

Prepare a motion for a resolution enjoying broad support from the political groups and foresee adoption of the resulting text along the ITRE model, largely following recent DEVE practice. ITRE's Chair together with shadows from the other political groups reach agreement on a draft motion for a resolution, which is then endorsed by the committee through a vote without amendments.

3. DEVE scrutiny activities

Decision:

Agree that each of the Working Groups would be composed of 3 EPP, 2 S&D, 2 Renew, 1 ID, 1 Greens, 1 ECR, 1 The Left Members, and that NI would be able to appoint one Member to one WG. In addition, each group should be free to appoint rapporteurs, from among their Members, to follow different subjects in their remit.

Mandate the Secretariat to launch a written procedure regarding the urgent appointment of Chairs and Vice-Chairs to the three WGs, in view of the first Working Group meetings on 3 and 4 June.
