



The Humanitarian aid budget line

MFF 2014 – 2020: € 5.9 billion MFF 2021 – 2027: €10.3 billion

Around €1.5bn per year

SEAR


The Solidarity and Emergency Aid Reserve (EUSF + EAR)

Does the EU enable DG ECHO to respond to humanitarian crises worldwide according to its <u>ambitions</u>?





Humanitarian needs around the globe



346.6 million people in need in 2023 (GHO 2023, February update):

- 72.6 million more than forecast in 2022 (GHO 2022)
- 211.6 million more than forecast in 2018 (GHO 2018)

Major changes since the design of the MFF: unprecedented food crisis in the Horn of Africa, long-lasting effects of Covid-19, numerous disasters, conflict in Ukraine


Crises driving needs:

- Number of conflicts has more than doubled in the decade to 2020 (SOHS)
- Number of climate-related disasters has increased annually since 2018 (SOHS)
- Ukraine conflict has increased global food, fuel, and fertilizer prices, and will contribute to food shortages in 2023 and beyond (GHI 2022)
- Crises are becoming more protracted
- Number of people expected to face acute food insecurity reached 222 million (GHO 2023)
- 100 million people displaced in 2022 (<u>UNHCR</u>)



The humanitarian funding gap





Trends in response plan/appeal requirements (<u>UN FTS</u>)





A gap of unprecedented scale:

- 2022: Only 57% of the UN GHO was covered = funding gap of \$22.2 billion (<u>FTS</u>)
- 2023: \$54.4 billion needed to assist 238.7 million of the 346.6 million people in need (GHO 2023 update)

<u>Funding imbalances between crises (FTS):</u>

- Ukraine 84% funded
- Mozambique 29.4%
- Haiti cholera Flash appeal 10%


Too few substantial humanitarian donors:

- The US and the EU (EC + MS) accounted for 80% of the global humanitarian funding in 2022 (FTS 2022)
- In 2022, 70% of global humanitarian funding came from just 5 donors and 80% came from 10 (FTS 2022)
- No reliable data re some EU MSs' ODA contributions

VOICE European humanitarian NGO: Standing together.

HUMA

- 2022: from €1.8bn to €2.6bn
- 2023: starts at €1.8bn because no margins left under Heading 6

SEAR

- · 2021:

 - None of the funds available from October were allocated to external crises
- · 2022:
 - o <u>€539 million</u> allocated to humanitarian crises outside Europe
 - €211 million earmarked for external crises frozen
 - Reinforcements linked to Ukraine

March 2023:

HUMA already reinforced **twice** by SEAR

! Largely for foreseeable crises

SEAR earmarking for external crises already fully committed*

→ MFF is inadequate to allow EU to maintain its humanitarian ambitions



Opportunities to maintain the EU's humanitarian ambition



How can DG ECHO be best supported?

HUMA:

- From 2024 onwards, HUMA should start at €2.6 billion
- Not at the expense of development funding

• SEAR:

- SEAR must remain additional to HUMA
- On 1st September, remaining funds must be allocated to external crises
- At least 35% of the end-of-year cushion must be allocated to external crises

Quality funding:

Support DG ECHO in maintaining its principled approach to humanitarian aid

Beyond the EC's budget:

Increase MS' own humanitarian budgets and support the expansion of the donor base
