Loukas Tsoukalis is Professor at the Paris School of International Affairs, Sciences Po, and Emeritus Professor of the University of Athens. He is also President of the Board of the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP), Greece's leading think tank. He studied economics and international relations at the University of Manchester, the College of Europe in Bruges, and the University of Oxford where he obtained his doctoral degree and taught for many years. He later became Jean Monnet Professor of European Integration at the University of Athens and Eleftherios Venizelos Professor at the European Institute of the London School of Economics. He was Visiting Professor at the Kennedy School, Harvard University, the EUI in Florence, and for many years director of the economics department and visiting professor at the College of Europe. He has advised former presidents of the European Commission and the European Council.

His many books include *The New European Economy*; *What Kind of Europe?*; *In Defence of Europe: Can the European Project Be Saved?* which were translated into several languages. He was the editor of the *Journal of Common Market Studies*. In 2021, Oxford University Press published a Festschrift *Europe's Transformations: Essays in Honour of Loukas Tsoukalis* with contributions from leading thinkers and policy makers.

His new book *Europe's Coming of Age* was published by Polity Press in October 2022. He has received decorations from several countries as well as many academic distinctions and awards.



Gaby Umbach is a part-time professor at the Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies (RSCAS) of the European University Institute (EUI), where she leads the Global Governance programme's research area on 'Knowledge, Governance, Transformations'. She is also co-principal of the EUI's interdisciplinary research cluster on 'Crisis of Expert Knowledge and Authority'. She is a non-resident visiting fellow at EPRS and adjunct professor at the Universities of Innsbruck and LUISS Guido Carli/CIFE. She is an academic advisor and author of the Enlightenment 2.0 programme of the European Commission's Joint Research Centre and is also involved in the ESPAS Futurium expert group on horizon scanning. An associate editor for Cambridge University Press since 2022, she holds a PhD in political science from Cologne University.
