Sociological research was conducted by the Civil Network OPORA and Sociological Group “Rating” during April - May, 2023

3 stages of the research:

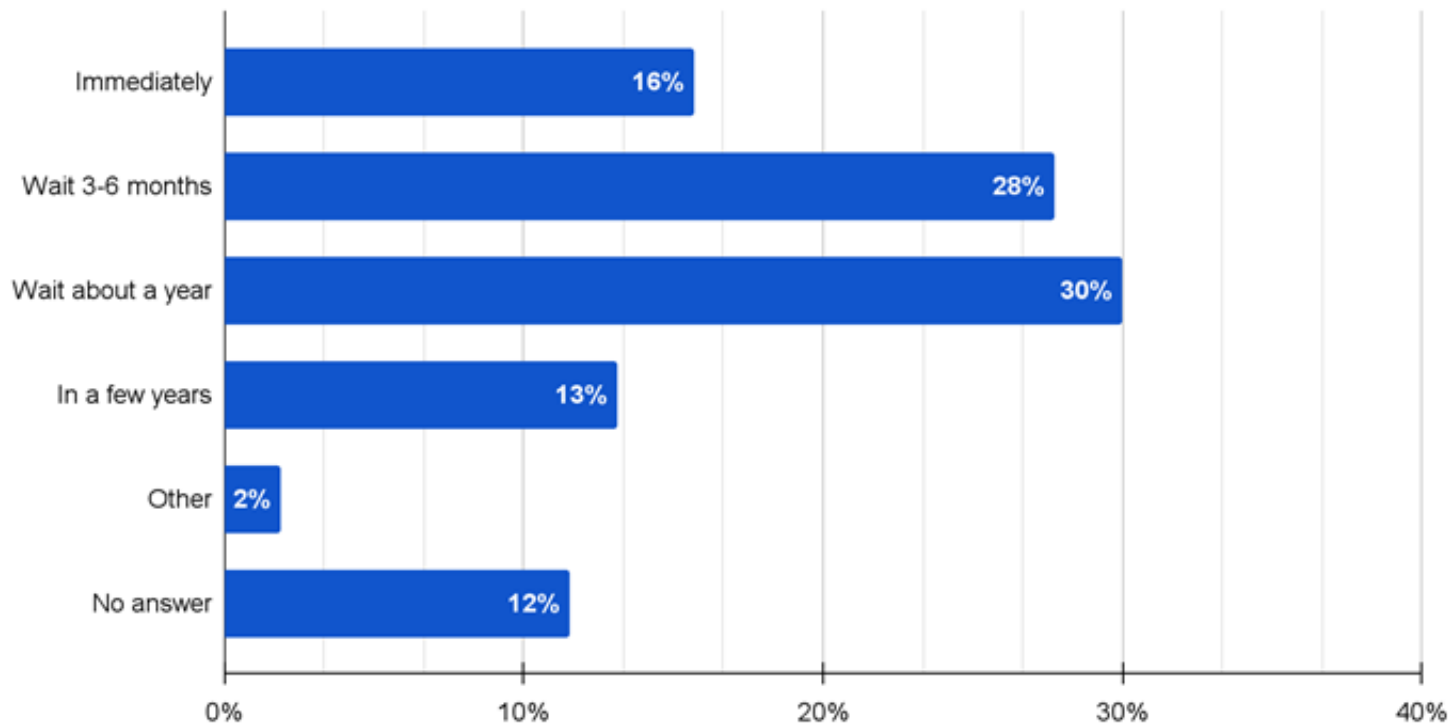
1. Political and civil participation: 1047 respondents from 7 countries.
2. A diary survey on media consumption: 400 respondents filled out the questionnaire for 5 days (2084 questionnaires were collected in total).
3. In - depth survey - 47 respondents.

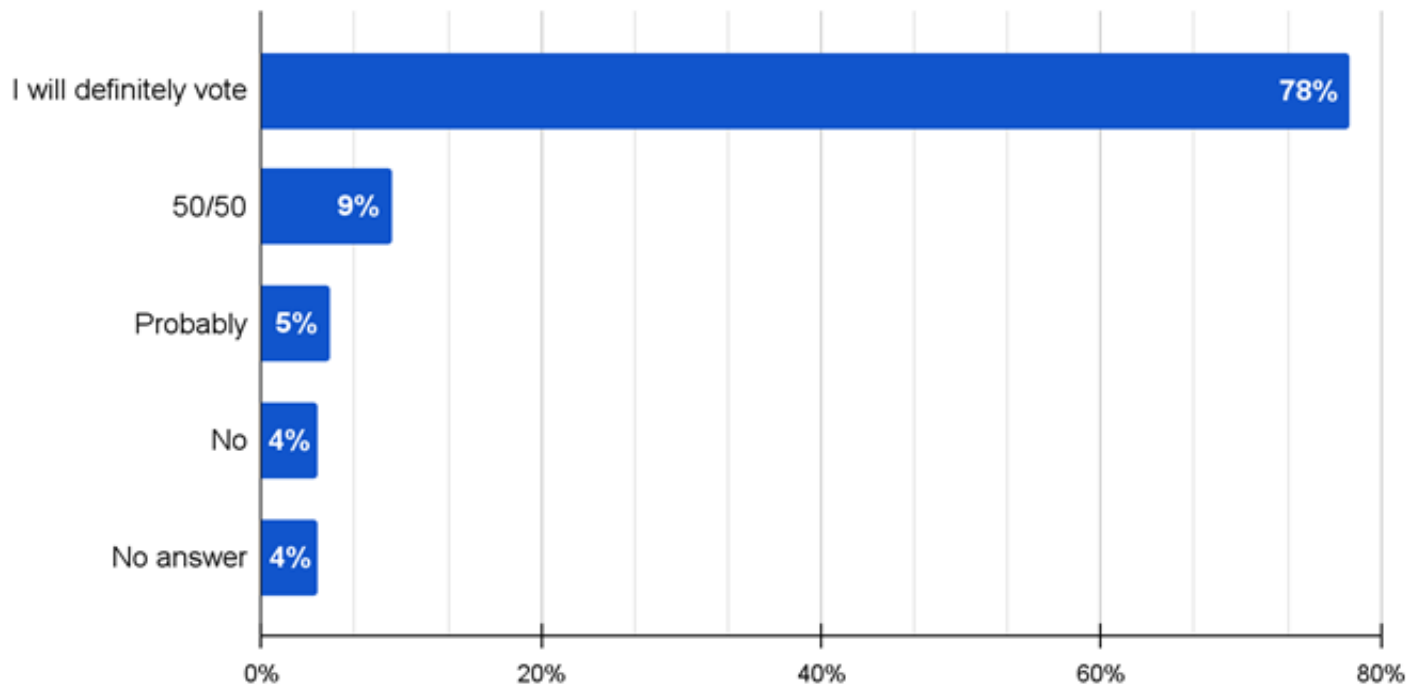
First post - war elections

In your opinion, when can the first elections be held in Ukraine after the end of the martial law?



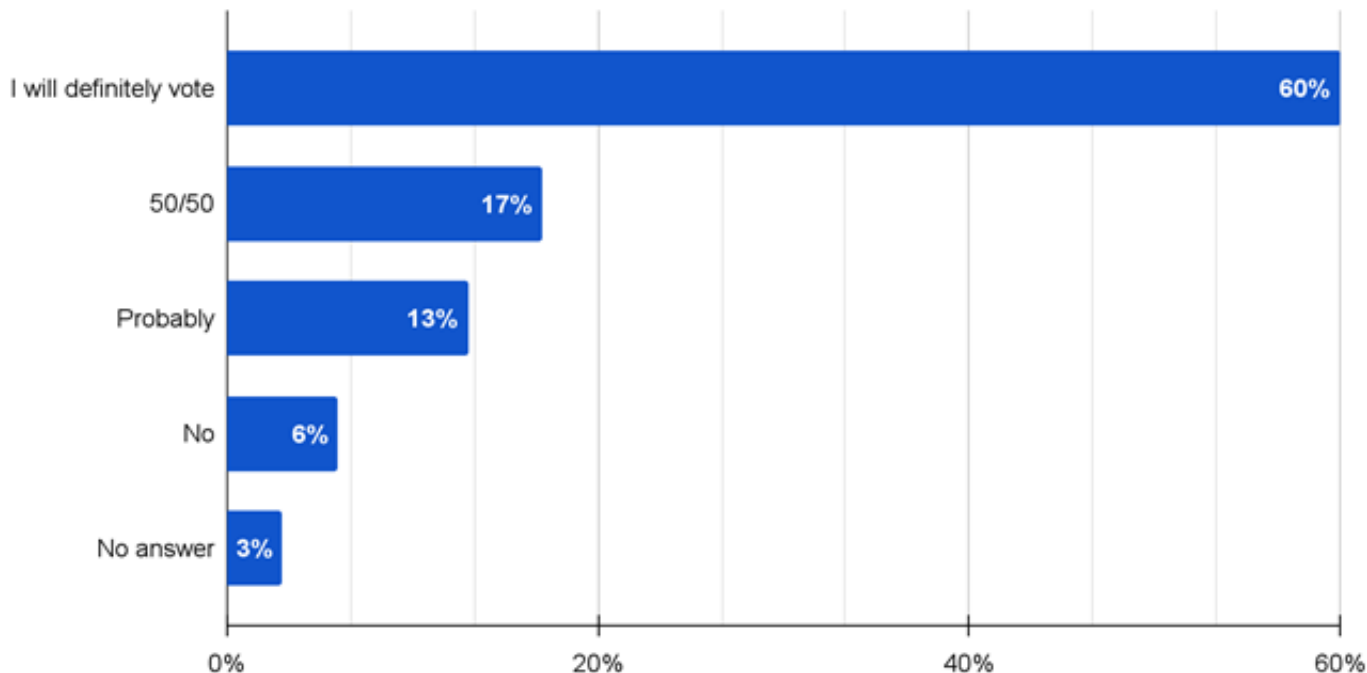
Likelihood assessment of voting participation (being in Ukraine at the time of voting)

What is the likelihood that you will vote in the first post-war elections if you return to Ukraine at this time?



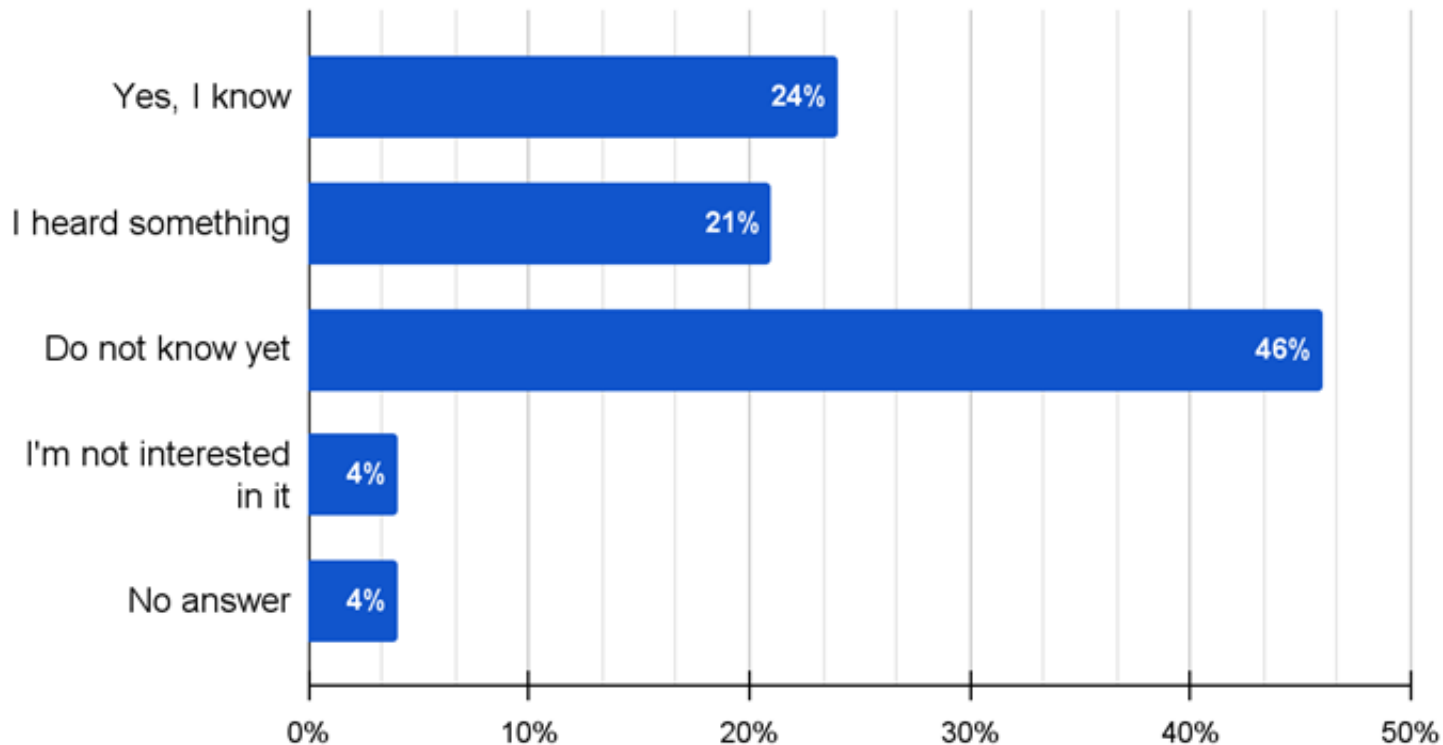
Likelihood assessment of voting participation (being abroad at the time of voting)

What is the likelihood that you will vote in the first post-war elections if you are abroad at this time?



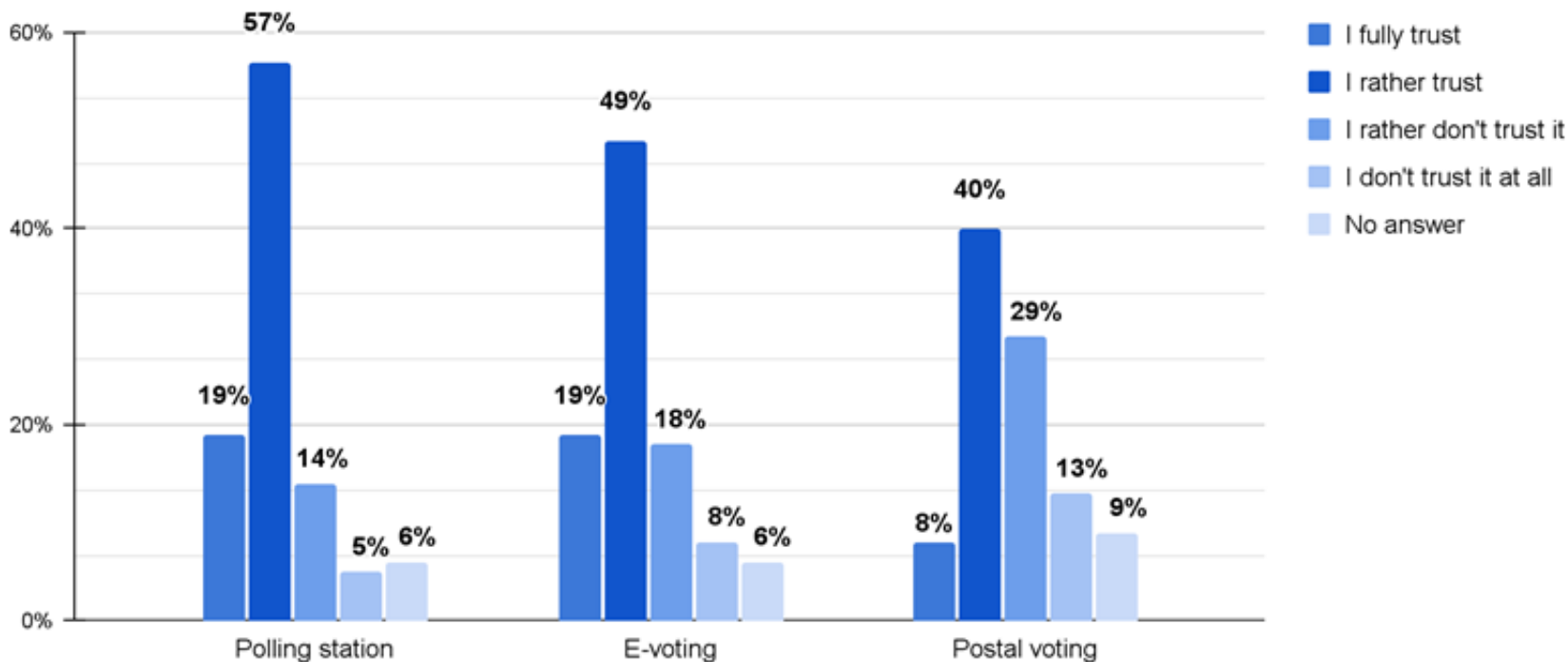
Awareness of the voting procedure abroad
