Michael GAHLER has been Member of the European Parliament (Germany, EPP) since 1999. He is currently serving as coordinator of the EPP Group in the committee on foreign affairs, and is substitute member of the subcommittee on security and defence as well as of the committee on transport and tourism. He is vice chair of the EP's delegation to the ACP-EU Joint Parliamentary Assembly, member of the delegation for relations with South Africa as well as substitute member of the delegation for relations with the Pan-African Parliament. He studied law in Germany, with further studies in France, and later joined the diplomatic academy of the German foreign office (1990-1991), after which he spent two years as a desk officer in the department of 'international environmental politics'. From 1993-1995, he was the desk officer in the international office of the Christian Democratic Union (CDU). Between 1995 and 1999, again with the German foreign office, he was a desk officer for the Baltic States and the Council of the Baltic Sea states.





Ruth DEYERMOND is Senior Lecturer (Associate Professor) in Post-Soviet Security in the Department of War Studies, King's College London. She previously worked in HM Treasury in areas including UK policy towards the International Financial Institutions. Her primary research areas are Russian foreign and security policy, particularly in relation to Europe, the US, and the states of the former Soviet Union, and US policy towards Russia. Her publications include *Security and Sovereignty in the Former Soviet Union*, and numerous articles and chapters on Russian and US foreign policy. She has been a frequent media contributor on the issue of the current war in Ukraine, including to the BBC, The Washington Post, El Pais, and the Observer. She is a regular commentator on the war for Prospect. She has given evidence on the war to the UK Parliament's National Security Strategy Joint Committee.



Jana JUZOVA is a Senior Research Fellow and Head of the Global Europe Programme at EUROPEUM Institute for European Policy. Previously she cooperated with other Central European think tanks and EULEX EU's Rule of Law Mission to Kosovo. She was a Visiting Scholar in the Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik in Brussels and a ReThink.CEE Fellow in the German Marshall Fund of the United States. In her research, she focuses primarily on the Western Balkans, EU enlargement, and regional cooperation in CEE. She graduated in International Relations from Masaryk University in Brno.



Nicolai VON ONDARZA is the Head of the EU/Europe Research Division at the German Institute for International and Security Affairs (Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik, SWP) in Berlin. His work focuses on the governance of the EU, EU democracy and UK-EU relations after Brexit. He was recently a member of the Franco-German expert group on EU institutional reform and Co-Rapporteur of the CEPS-SWP High-Level Group on Bolstering EU Democracy. Recent Publications include *The Crisis Governance of the European Union* and *Getting Ready - Ukraine's potential accession and EU institutional reform*.





Ievgen KYLYMNYK is a Regional Project Manager for UNDP Eurasia working on innovation and systems transformation in Europe and Central Asia.
