European Semester for economic policy coordination: employment and social priorities for 2024

The European Semester is the European Union's framework for coordination and surveillance of economic and social policies. It is one of the most important tools in the governance system, as it directly influences the implementation of the EU's fiscal rules and other policies. Until 2022, the European Parliament's involvement in the Semester (via the EMPL and ECON Committees) consisted of two sets of annual Own-Initiative Reports. In 2022, EMPL and ECON decided to draw one report each in parallel with a view to their adoption in plenary in March, before the Spring European Council. This was to allow for a



more substantial input of the European Parliament and to increase the weight of its resolutions in the Semester Cycle, while better promoting the Committees' views on the EU's social and employment priorities.

The Committee will vote on its report, with Dragoş Pîslaru acting as Rapporteur, on 14 February. In the larger context of the review of the EU's economic governance framework, including its fiscal rules, the report focuses on the modernisation of labour markets, of welfare systems and on good quality jobs in the green and digital transitions.

Highlights of the EMPL Meeting on 14 February 2024

A European Platform to combat homelessness - Exchange of views with Yves Leterme (Chair of the Steering Board of the European Platform on Combating Homelessness)



The European Platform on Combating Homelessness ("EPOCH") was established by the European Commission in March 2021, as part of the European Pillar of Social Rights Action Plan. Launched in June 2021 in the framework of the Lisbon Declaration, the Platform aims to eradicate homelessness by 2030 by pursuing a triple objective: promoting person-centered approaches, fostering the exchange of best practices between practitioners and policy-makers,

and developing evidence-based strategies and monitoring. The Platform gathers EU level civil society organisations, social partners, EU governments and institutions. It situates itself at the crossroads of the Union's fundamental principles: the Union's mandate to combat social exclusion (Art. 3 of the Treaty on European Union); Principle 19 of the European Pillar of Social Rights which promotes the right to housing assistance of good quality and protection; and the 2030 UN Sustainable Goals which call to eradicate homelessness and ensure safe and affordable housing for all. The Platform also contributes to harnessing EU funding opportunities such as the 2021-2027 Multiannual Financial Framework and the NexGeneration EU recovery instrument. Yves Leterme, Chair of the Steering Board of the Platform , will update the EMPL Committee on what the Platform has achieved since its inception and on its future challenges.

News from the agencies

Eurofound

A new report on self-employment in the EU

Eurofound published on 30 January 2024 the main results of a large research report on the status of self-employment in the European Union during and after the Covid pandemic. Amongst its findings the report highlights that dependent self-employed face similar situations as employees with little autonomy over how and when they do their job. The report also stresses that economically dependent self-employed persons were twice as likely as employees to face in-work poverty during Covid-19, as a substantial part of the self-employed



worked in unstable sectors of activity. Relatedly, dependent self-employed persons experience more difficulties in accessing social protection, thus leading to increased pressure on mental health, well-being and lower life-satisfaction.

Cedefop

Roadmapping the skills revolution

Cedefop will organise on 11 March 2024 a <u>virtual get-together</u> with stakeholders and users of skills intelligence to present its new <u>skills</u> intelligence tool. This new tool brings together in one single platform Cedefop's monitoring of skills anticipation in EU Member States, a



consolidated presentation of skills intelligence indicators, a new collection of data insights for occupations and new thematic dashboards which look at trends in employment and skills from multiple angles.

European Training Foundation



Countries of Eastern and South-Eastern Europe reforming Lifelong Learning Systems

The European Training Foundation will organise a hybrid conference on "The way towards EU Integration: countries of Eastern and South-Eastern Europe reforming Lifelong Learning Systems" in Brussels on 13 March 2024. Organised in partnership with the German Adult Education Association (DVV international) and the European Association for the Education of Adults (EAEA) under the Belgian Presidency of the Council, the conference will offer stakeholders,

representatives of national governments, EU institutions and civil society organisations a high-level platform to discuss the state of play, opportunities and current challenges in the area of adult education.

EU-OSHA

International Festival of Occupational Safety and Health: 2024, third edition



The Rubes Trivia Foundation in cooperation with Urbino University and INAI, <u>EU-OSHA Italian focal point</u>, will organise the third edition of the International Festival of Occupational Safety and Health in

Pesaro, Italy, from 12 to 14 June 2024. This event, which will gather representatives of EU institutions, agencies and national governments, academics and practitioners, will be the opportunity to take stock of the current legislation of EU Member States in OSH areas and provide a platform for recommendations on improving the well-being of workers, in line with the principles set forth in the <u>Urbino Charter</u> presented in March 2023. The Festival wants to stimulate a comprehensive reflection on and around the meaning of work as a "sphere of expression, realization, integration, and inclusion of the person and, equally, on the protection of its dignity" (see draft <u>Programme</u>).

European Labour Authority

A Capacity Building Strategy for 2024-2030

The European Labour Authority has unveiled its <u>Capacity Building Strategy for 2024-2030</u> to support Member States in the implementation of EU labour mobility law. This strategic plan will reinforce the organisational competences of national authorities by providing them with better cooperation tools for a more efficient handling of cross-boarder issues in labour mobility, in particular undeclared work. The new consolidated strategy includes a 7-year



multi-annual plan and annual plans for capacity building activities. Its main objective will be to strengthen the knowledgeability of national administrations dealing with the application and enforcement of EU labour mobility law, to ensure that national authorities have a common understanding of the rules governing labour mobility and the competences required to deal with trends in labour mobility. The Capacity Building Strategy includes dedicated trainings, workshops, toolkits, mutual learning programmes, study visits and best practices exchange events.

Other event of interest

Agorithmic management practices in regular workplaces: Joint ILO and JRC event

The digitalisation of the world of work is profoundly changing the way we think about and organise the workplace. Its impact on working conditions and industrial relations is already tangible. While digital workplaces can offer gains of productivity at all levels of the supply chain, it can also generate risks of social backsliding threatening workers' right to quality jobs and decent working conditions. To reflect on the opportunities and challenges of digitalisation in the workplace,



the ILO and the Joint Research Centre (JRC) of the European Commission will launch their report on "Algorithmic management practices in regular workplaces" on 23 February as part of an in-person event, in Brussels. The study highlights the prevalence of algorithmic management in the logistics and healthcare sector and studies the impact of digitalisation from the organisation of work to industrial relations.
