Tourism Task Force: the work programme 1st half of 2024 (until 18 April 2024)

- 1. <u>Tourism Task Force (TTF) meetings</u> (during the TRAN committee slots)
- Week 4 (23 January 2024): Presentation by the EU Presidency of the priorities in the field of tourism.
- Week 10 (4 March 2024, tbc): Transition pathway for tourism. Presentation by the European Commission of the 2023 stocktaking report, which will provide a structured analysis of the measures and present the recommendations should there be a need to revise the measures, targets or support mechanisms.
- **2. Extraordinary TTF meetings** (only TTF Members)

- 3. Legislative and Non-Legislative Work
- 1) Own-initiative Reports: INI on tourism could be envisaged for the beginning of next legislature.
- 2) TRAN followed up on the legislative and non-legislative proposals from the Commission and remained <u>involved in the work with the other committees</u> on relevant tourism aspects. The ongoing procedures will be transferred to the next legislature:
 - **Digitalisation of travel documents and facilitation of travel** (legislative, incl. the impact assessment. The Commission expects its proposal to be published in Q4 2023):
 - Revision of the **Passenger rights regulatory framework** (legislative, incl. the impact assessment. The Commission expects its proposal to be published in Q4 2023);
 - Revision of the **Package Travel Directive** (legislative, incl. the impact assessment. The Commission expects its proposal to be published in Q4 2023; adoption is foreseen on 29 November 2023).

3. Public Hearings and Studies

- There were no specific tourism related issues among the selected proposals on <u>public</u> <u>hearings</u> for the 1st half of 2024 (agreed by TRAN Coordinators on 25 October 2023).
- On 25 October 2023, TRAN Coordinators approved the TRAN research programme 2024 regarding the study on the *Silver Economy / longevity economy and the tourism industry*. (It is expected that the study will be ready Q3-Q4, 2024).

4. Cooperation with the other EU Institutions and stakeholders

- Establishing and maintaining contacts with the **Belgian Presidency** by TRAN Chairwoman and the TTF Steering Group.
 - Discussion on the priorities in the field of tourism by the EU Presidency.
 (Bilateral meeting between the Chairwoman, the TTF Steering Group Members and Ms Valérie De Bue, Belgian Minister of Tourism requested by the TTF SG Members TBC).
- Upholding close cooperation with the **Commission** (DG GROW) at the political and operational levels (TTF Steering Group and TRAN Secretariat).
- Upholding close cooperation with the **Committee of Regions** (**CoR**) and the **European Economic and Social Committee** (**EESC**).

5. Other Tourism-Related Activities:

- 1) <u>Budgetary matters</u>: Due to the European elections, the budgetary procedure next year will be different. The PP-PAs pre-assessment will be organised in two rounds: the deadline for current Members will be in March and for newly elected Members in September 2024
- 2) TRAN missions: no TRAN missions/delegations are foreseen for the 1st half of 2024 due the electoral period.
- 3) Members' participation in the high-level conferences/events on tourism matters on the *ad hoc* basis.
- 4) Depending on the circumstances and the situation, TTF keeps the right to submit proposals and take appropriate initiatives (draft letters, motions for resolution, propose plenary debates, etc.).
