Amendments to Parliament's Rules of Procedure implementing the parliamentary reform "Parliament 2024"

AFCO Members will vote on the report on Amendments to Parliament's Rules of Procedure implementing the parliamentary reform "Parliament 2024". The report reflects the outcome of the work carried out by the Working Group 'Parliament 2024', which was set up by the Conference of Presidents (CoP) in January 2023. The reform proposals aim at strengthening the internal working methods of Parliament, its institutional role, and its capacity to act. They cover five areas, namely legislation, scrutiny, budgetary functions and budgetary control, plenary, and external relations.

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Study on "The Role of the European Council in the EU Constitutional Structure"

Dr. Mark DAWSON, Professor of European Law and Governance at Hertie School, Berlin, and Dr. Adina AKBIK, Senior Assistant Professor of European Politics at Leiden University, will present their study commissioned for AFCO by the Policy Department for Citizens' Rights and Constitutional Affairs. The study explores the changing role of the European Council within the constitutional framework of the EU. Specifically, it analyses the growing disparity between the European Council's designated role as outlined in the EU Treaties and its actual function within the broader system of EU governance.



AFCO Public Hearing on the "Constitutional aspects of the future of Europe"

The public hearing will focus on the future of Europe including the work of the Conference on the Future of Europe and the recently adopted Treaty Change Resolution by the European Parliament. The event would allow AFCO Members to take stock of what has been achieved so far and to look ahead to the way forward as suggested in the Parliament's proposals to amend the Treaties. Experts from academic world and think tanks along with the representatives of the Commission and the Council will share their vison with Members on how to enhance the competences, role and scope of action of the EU and to strengthen links between citizens and their elected representatives, while increasing accountability and transparency, promoting citizen participation and a more inclusive decision-making process.

Report from the Commission to the European Parliament and the Council on the application of Regulation (EU) 2019/788 on the European citizens' initiative

In this meeting, the Commission will present its first report on the application of Regulation (EU) 2019/788 on the European citizens' initiative (ECI Regulation), which applies since 1 January 2020. Its aim is to make the ECI more accessible, less burdensome and easier to use for organisers and supporters.

According to this Regulation, the Commission must periodically review the functioning of the ECI. AFCO has contributed to this review by drafting an implementation report on the ECI Regulation, on the basis of which Parliament has adopted a resolution on 13 June 2023.
