A result-based approach in Cohesion Policy Theory



 A negative trade-off between the input controls and analysis of the policy results.

A result-based approach in Cohesion Policy Historic perspective



- The requirements for the input controls in the delivery system of Cohesion policy have increased throughout the periods (1994-99, 2000-06, 2007-13)
- The initial draft amendments to the Financial Regulation demonstrate a step in the same direction

Lessons for the future *Reform*



 A connection between eligibility and the results achieved, as opposed to a solely costbased financial management

Lessons for the future *System*



- Increased role of evaluation and monitoring of the results
- Accordingly reduced proportion of controls and reporting

Lessons for the future Horizontal policies



 Horizontal policies, in particular public procurement and state aid steal the administrative capacity from managing results

Lessons for the future Subsidiarity



 Each EU member state/region chooses priorities at national level and agrees with the Commission on the outputs and results

Lessons for the future Targets



- S.M.A.R.T. (specific, measurable, attainable, relevant, time-bound) output and result indicators
- Streamlining on the most essential EU level results
- Indicators determined before finalizing of the next programming period preparation

Lessons for the future *Impact*



- Targeting of the policy impact proved inefficient
- Impact assessment by evaluation

Proposed solutions for reduction of the control burden (I) Plan A



- Member states and the Commission agree on targets
- Member states deliver results and get paid
- Clear methodology for financial corrections
- Experience of the World Bank and ENPI

Proposed solutions for reduction of the control burden (II) Plan B



- More and simpler simple costs
- Horisontal priorities enforced outside Cohesion policy delivery

Lessons for the future Conditionalities



- Conditionalities directly related to efficiency and sustainability of the results
- Have experience with ex-ante conditionalities
- Performance reserve not justified
