


Key observations


- Policies were largely focused on a supply-side, investment grants to individual beneficiaries and evidence of a too generic imitation of cluster policies. Only few examples of support to governance, human capital for innovation, market and innovation culture.
- Innovation governance could not be assessed as fairly effective.
- Several barriers encountered during the implementation stage.
- The availability of robust evidence-based assessments leaves room for improvement.
- Regions in the process of finding a new balance (vertical coordination).
- So far a preference given to traditional methodologies when it comes to identifying the areas of smart specialisation.

How innovation policies are changing regional innovation systems in EU regions?




Patterns in key performance indicators (I)




Patterns in key performance indicators (II)






