






Interoperability:



Single Objective:

The ISA² programme shall **facilitate** efficient and effective electronic **cross-border or cross-sector** interaction between **European public administrations** and between them and **citizens and businesses**.

Identify, create and operate interoperability solutions of unlimited use to other Union institutions and bodies, and to national, regional and local public administrations

Enable the delivery of electronic public services supporting the implementation of Union policies and activities




Pilot interoperability solutions as a **solution incubator** OR **sustain** them as a **solution bridge**

% of people interacting over the internet with public authorities to obtain information: 72%







