Short-term challenges

Loss of EU's main export market for dairy products (13% in terms of volumes and 13,4% in terms of value) and consequently the current market pressure

...but also opportunities




Figure 9.7. Major dairy product importers


World dairy prices vs EU dairy prices

Extreme market volatility and maintaning milk producers in business

☐ Tools:

✓ to prevent EU market collapse and farmers going out of business; make it more efficient?

Safety nets

- Public intervention:
 - level below cost of producion of milk producers
 - inadequate to maintain production potential in times of crisis
 - regional approach?
- Private storage
- <u>Export refunds</u> financing? \Longrightarrow Alternatives? More dynamic tools? Export credit insurance?
- Dairy coops play an important role in reducing market volatility
- ✓ **to manage risk** (complementary to safety nets):

Risk management tools

- <u>Dairy trade derivatives/futures market</u> where are we with discussion at EU level?
- <u>Fixed price contracts</u> New Zealand, US, Ireland; rest of the EU?

✓ Milk package – early stage, important developments so far

Compulsory contracts – mainly in countries where dairy coops have a lower market share

Ensure a good functioning of the dairy supply chain and better income for producers

- **Need for a proper functioning of the dairy supply chain:**
 - "fear factor", "below cost selling" not acceptable
 - voluntary initiatives should be underpinned by legislative measures
- ❖ Milk Market Observatory need for increased transparency across the whole dairy supply chain
- **❖ Income stabilisation tool** more targeted to dairy sector?



Have all conditions in place for milk producing and processing to maintain dairy production across the whole EU

Regions with structural difficulties, natural handicaps

Challenges for producers:

- Producing at reasonable costs
- Having access to processing facilities/not enough processing facilities
- Continue milk production from generation to generation

Challenges for dairy coops:

Dairy coops are often the only processing option

- Small size, less modern
- High collection and processing costs



Have all conditions in place for milk producing and processing to maintain dairy production across the whole EU

☐ Tools:

- ✓ **Dairy cooperatives** need support to continue their activity, in particular in disadvantaged (mountainous) and to modernize;
- ✓ **Supporting milk collection costs** would be important
- **✓** Coupled support
- ✓ Support for areas with natural and other specific constraints
- ✓ Promoting mountain milk
- ✓ Support for quality schemes
