Plenary vote

Members get ready for the final vote on measures aiming to stop trade in illicitly mined "conflict minerals" fuelling armed conflicts, while promoting legitimate trade helping people in conflict and highrisk areas. INTA has enhanced the draft measures envisaging a voluntary approach by obliging smelters and refiners to perform due diligence, while giving other companies incentives to opt in. The draft on conflict-free mineral trade will be put to vote during the 18-21 May plenary sitting.

Commissioner Malmström refines plans on investment protection in TTIP Exchange of views



Following preliminary ideas on revamped investment protection and ISDS mechanism presented in INTA on 18 March, Commissioner Malmström will present the Commission's arguments on the most suitable legal mechanism for protecting EU investors when they invest in the US and vice versa. In 2014, the Commission undertook a consultation on the question of investor state dispute settlement, i.e. a separate system of redress whereby investors under certain circumstances could launch cases against states in arbitration tribunals. In the framework of the Structured Dialogue between the Parliament and the Commission, Commissioner Malmström will address the key issues in the Commission Work Programme of 2015 and the one to be launched in 2016.

The Structured Dialogue is a regular exchange of views between the two institutions in order to seek a common understanding based on the Commission Work Programme.

INTA scrutinizes the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement

Exchange of views

INTA will discuss the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement for which Parliament's consent is required. The rapporteur is Mr Pablo Zalba (EPP) and the DEVE Committee is also contributing through an opinion. The Trade Facilitation Agreement is the first multilateral agreement concluded by the WTO since it was founded in 1995. Under the agreement customs procedures will be accelerated and trade costs will be reduced by around 10-15% thus helping SMEs to access new markets. Furthermore, the EU and other donors will contribute financially to improve customs systems of developing and least developed countries. The EU has budgeted €400 million for the period 2015-2020.

INTA will discuss a draft opinion that supports coherent and simple EU-level system of GI protection for non-agricultural products. Such system would make it possible to achieve similar protection for the European products outside the EU in the framework of international trade negotiations, also on a multilateral level.

The vote is to take place during June INTA meeting and the adopted opinion will contribute to the report of Committee on Legal Affairs.

INTA examines trade implications of animal cloning

Trade MEPs will further discuss proposed changes to the draft legislation on cloning of animals for farming purposes. Members aim to ensure that products derrived from clones and their descendants do not enter the EU market, while warranting that the proposed measures are WTO-compatible. Amendments to the rapporteur's opinion range from suggestions to extend the scope of the rules to cover all species of farmed animals to the propositions for an outright rejection of the draft law. opinion will feed into a legislative report drafted by the ENVI and AGRI committees.

Uzbekistan: INTA hears experts on forced and child labour

Exchange of views with stakeholders



Trade MEPs return to the scrutiny of the situation in Uzbekistan. In 2011 the Parliament adopted an <u>interim report</u>, making the consent to the EU-Textiles Protocol to the Partnership and Cooperation Agreement conditional upon eradication of forced and child labour during the cotton harvest in Uzbekistan. INTA members kept the pressure for progress on human rights via a regular dialogue with the Commission, the International Labour Organisation, the Uzbek ambassador and civil society. On 7 May these stakeholders will return to give the latest update, enabling INTA to take stock of the progress in Uzbekistan. An important element in the discussion will be the <u>latest report of the ILO Committee of Experts</u>. INTA members will decide whether sufficient progress has been made to warrant reconsidering giving consent to the Textile Protocol.

Annual reports 2012-2013 on subsidiarity and proportionality

Consideration of draft opinion

INTA will consider a draft opinion to the own-initiative report by the JURI committee on Annual reports 2012-2013 on subsidiarity and proportionality. The draft points out several uncertainties regarding the application of the above principles in the common commercial policy notably in the field of investment protection. Moreover, the draft opinion calls for more realistic and broader ex-ante impact assessments of major EU trade agreements as well as for more involvement of the civil society and SMEs in the decision-making process regarding the EU trade policy.

INTA members will discuss the finding of <u>a study</u> on the impact of tough choices of the six countries in the EU's Eastern Partnership, sandwiched between Brussels and Moscow. Georgia, Moldova and later Ukraine decided to sign Association Agreements with the EU, while Belarus and belatedly Armenia chose to adhere to the Russian-led Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU).

STATE-OF-PLAY OF THE UNION'S TRADE DEFENCE INSTRUMENTS (TDI)

On-going investigations and measures in force

<u>Investigations</u>

On 31 March 2015, there were 81 anti-dumping and 14 countervailing in force. Furthermore, there were undertakings in force from 4 countries covering 5 products. At the end of March, 37 investigations were on-going. 5 investigations were initiated: 1 new anti-subsidy investigation, 1 expiry review, 1 interim review, 1 other review, 1 anti-circumvention investigation.

New proceedings initiated in 2015:

- Anti-subsidy proceeding concerning imports of tubes and pipes of ductile cast iron (also known as spheroidal graphite cast iron), originating in India, OJ C 83, 11.3.2015

Measures

2 provisional antidumping measures were imposed involving imports from 2 countries and covering 1 product; 2 definitive measures were imposed, involving imports from 2 countries and covering 2 products, and the Commission accepted undertakings offered by exporters in 1 case, 11 reviews were concluded with confirmation of duty.

Terminations

1 new investigation and 2 reviews were concluded by termination.

RECENT WTO DISPUTE SETTLEMENT DEVELOPMENTS

Latest DSU developments as of 24 April 2015

- DS487 (United States Conditional Tax Incentives for Large Civil Aircraft); the panel was composed on 22 April 2015.
- Products); On 8 April 2015 China requested consultations with the European Union regarding measures to modify the EU tariff concessions on certain poultry meat products. The measures are the result of two EU requests to modify the EU tariff concessions on certain poultry meat products under Article XXVIII of the GATT 1994 in 2006 and in 2009. These modifications in 2007 came about following the WTO panel lost to Brazil and Thailand (DS 269/DS286) on the tariff classification of some poultry products (mainly meat with some added salt) following a GATT Article XXVIII procedure. Following the WTO rules the increase of these duties was accompanied, after negotiation with interested parties, by the opening of tariff-rate quotas (TRQ) for the products concerned. A second exercise under Article XXVIII GATT was launched in June 2009 by the European Union and concerned 8 further tariff lines for processed poultry meat.
- DS485 (Russia Tariff Treatment of Certain Agricultural and Manufacturing Products); the panel was established on 25 March 2015.


