This month's meeting will also include discussions with some prominent guests: ACER Director Alberto Pototschnig and the Chairman of the Board of Regulators, Lord Mogg, who will present a first outline of the Agency's draft work programme for 2016. we will host Jean-Pierre Bourguignon, President of the European Research Council (ERC) on the occasion of 5000th ERC signing its agreement.

international climate agreement in Paris Consideration of a draft opinion

This year the Commission has issued a Communication on which the European Parliament will react in the form of an own initiative report from the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Food Safety. This approach differs from the procedure on oral questions. The based Committee is involved in the form of an opinion with enhanced cooperation under Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure. The Commission proposal deals for an important part with climate diplomacy.

The draft opinion from the Rapporteur, Mr Kelly, addresses a number of subjects such as growth, jobs, competitiveness, clean energy, protection of property rights, the carbon leakage bio-sector, etc. rapporteur stresses that should other major competitors of the EU's energy-intensive industries fail to make similar commitments reductions, carbon provisions will be maintained in the long term and strengthened where necessary; he considers it vital that sustainable European agribusiness is protected against carbon leakage. Maintaining a level playing field for EU industry and the energy sector, to promote links between the EU ETS and other emission trading systems, with the aim of creating a future world emissions trading market to significantly reduce global emissions and increase industrial competitiveness are very important. A global phase-out of environmentally and economically harmful subsidies is necessary.

Draft report also calls on the US and China to play a more significant global climate role.

Mr Martin will present his draft report on developing a sustainable European industry of base metals.



The draft report addresses the present situation in Europe, where there is an accentuated loss of competitiveness of several basic materials industries such as aluminium, non-ferrous industries. The EU needs therefore to help building an efficient frame for these sectors in order to re-establish their economic potential. The draft ITRE report will focus on important issues in this context such as change, border adjustment measures, emissions policy, energy policy, transparency and merger acquisitions.

In ITRE, 138 amendments were tabled to the Commission proposal. 22 Compromise Amendments have been proposed by the Rapporteur.

In this legislative procedure LIBE and IMCO are associate committees. LIBE has exclusive competences regarding data protection issues. IMCO has provided an opinion parts of which have been included in the Compromise Amendments.

The draft report and most of the amendments aim to clarify some aspects of the Decision and reinforce the businesses and citizens dimensions.

### 2016 Budget – Mandate for the Trialogue

Adoption of a draft opinion

The Committee will vote on its opinion on mandate for the trialogue for 2016 EU budget. The aim of this opinion on the 2016



budget is to indicate ITRE priorities in the 2016 budget ahead the adoption of Council position.

In total 55 amendments were tabled to the draft opinion and 10 compromise amendments have been proposed by the draftsperson.

### ITRE priorities in the 2016 Budget, Exchange of views with José Manuel Fernandes, General Rapporteur for the 2016 Budget

Mr José Manuel Fernandes, EP General Rapporteur for the 2016 budget, will visit the ITRE Committee to present his draft report on a mandate for the trilogue, aimed at being the first assessment of the Commission's proposal by Parliament and at feeding into the trilogue to be held on 14 July 2015 in the Council.

The report will be based on the EP political priorities in 2016 budget as expressed in the EP resolution of 11 March 2015 on general guidelines for the preparation of the 2016 budget. The visit of Mr Fernandes to the ITRE Committee aims at briefing the ITRE Members about main features of the 2016 draft budget and at having an exchange of views with ITRE Members on the main budgetary priorities in 2016 budget.

### ACER Draft 2016 Work Programme Outline, Exchange of views with Alberto Pototschnig, Director of ACER

ACER Director Alberto Pototschnig and the Chairman of the Board of Regulators, Lord Mogg will present to the ITRE Committee a first outline of the Agency's draft work programme for 2016. They will suggest focusing on four main areas, namely the post 2014 completion of the internal energy market, the infrastructure challenge, the monitoring of wholesale energy markets other longer-term regulatory challenges. The debate in ITRE will enable the Agency to listen to the views expressed by Members and take them into account in the preparation of the draft

programme, which must be submitted to Board of Regulators, to the European Parliament and to the Commission by 30 June. Subsequently, the official 2016 work programme will be adopted until 30 September by the Agency's Administrative Board.

# Horizon 2020, Exchange of views with Jean-Pierre Bourguignon, President of the European Research Council

On 16 June Jean-Pierre Bourguignon, President of the European Research Council (ERC) will visit the ITRE Committee on the occasion of the ERC signing its 5000th grant agreement.

President Bourguignon will be accompanied by ERC grantees who will share their experiences of carrying out research with the financing of the ERC.

An <u>ERC exhibition</u> in the European Parliament Forum Area will present the results and discoveries of ERC funded research projects.

Set up in 2007 by the EU, the ERC is the first European funding organisation for excellent frontier research. With a budget of over 13 billion euros European Research Council is the largest single part of the EU's Horizon 2020 Framework Programme for Research and Innovation.
