Telecoms Single Market years: the Regulation, the ISA2 Decision and the oral question and resolution on big data. These issues are all important building blocks of the Digital Union that we are trying to create together in Europe. However, these files are not the final word on any of the issues they deal with; more work is still needed to create a truly single market for telecoms, more interoperability solutions need to be found in a range of fields, and more effort will be needed in the coming years to ensure the free and secure flow of data around Europe.

All these issues are also addressed in the Digital Single Market strategy, which we will be discussing with the new Director General of DG CNECT, Mr Roberto Viola. Moreover, we look forward to an exchange of views on Parliament's response to the DSM strategy in a joint ITRE/IMCO meeting.

Finally, another very important building block of the Digital Union will be discussed in depth at a public hearing: the digitalisation of the manufacturing industry.

On 13 October the first joint ITRE/IMCO meeting on the INI Report "Towards a Digital Single Market Act" will take place in

Co-Rapporteurs Kaja Kallas (ALDE) and Evelyne Gebhardt (S&D) and Members from both Committees will exchange views on the draft report. This strategic report will provide the Parliament response to the DSM Strategy launched by the Commission. ITRE and IMCO will follow the Joint Committees procedure foreseen in Rule 55 of the Rules of Procedure of the Parliament, and JURI, LIBE, CULT and EMPL will be associated Committees under Rule 54. TRAN and ECON Committees will also give an opinion under Rule 53. The vote of the Joint Committees is foreseen to take place in December.

European single market for electronic communications

Adoption of draft recommendation for second reading

The Committee will vote on the draft recommendation for second reading concerning the "Telecoms Single Market" Regulation. This regulation concerns the abolition of roaming surcharges, the safeguarding of net neutrality and the protection of end-user rights. A political agreement between the Parliament and Council was reached on 30 June, and this

agreement was endorsed by the ITRE committee in July. Council adopted its first-reading position on 1 October, in line with that agreement. This week's vote is on the ITRE committee's recommendation to plenary to approve the Council's first-reading position.

In total 249 amendments were tabled to the draft report of the rapporteur and 42 compromise amendments have been proposed by the rapporteur ahead of the vote.

The IMCO and LIBE committees have provided their opinions.

State of play of Digital Single Market actions, Exchange of views with Roberto Viola, Director General DG CNECT, European Commission

Mr Roberto VIOLA will address the ITRE Committee for the first time since his appointment as Director General of DG CNECT, which took effect on 1 September 2015. In his first blog post as Director General, Mr Viola said, "A proper industrial strategy for the digital sector is also a must for Europe, and challenges such as free flows of data, cloud computing supercomputing will be a big part of our work. And underpinning all this is our Europe's support for research and innovation capacity."

DG CNECT is responsible, in particular, for implementing the Commission's Digital Single Market Strategy, which was published in May 2015 and which contains 16 specific actions. Mr Viola will present the state of play of these actions.

Court of Auditors (ECA), Exchange of views with Ville Itälä, Member responsible for institutional Relations of the European Court of Auditors

Mr Ville ITÄLÄ, Member from the Court of Auditors responsible for institutional relations will brief the ITRE Committee on the cooperation between the Parliament and the Court of Auditors and how this cooperation could strengthen the exercise of scrutiny of the EU executive. Mr ITÄLÄ will also discuss the Work Programme for 2015 of the Court and in particular the special reports that the Court prepares.

European Court of Auditors is established to audit the EU's finances. The starting point for its audit work is the EU's budget and policies, primarily in areas relating to growth and jobs, added value, public finances, the environment and climate action. The ECA audits the budget in terms of both revenue and spending. The results of the ECA's work are used by the Commission, the European European Parliament, the Council and the Member States to oversee the management of the EU budget and, where necessary, make improvements.

# Public hearing on 'Digitalisation of the Manufacturing Industry and SMEs'

ITRE is organising a Public Hearing on the "Digitalisation of the European Manufacturing Industry and SMEs" as part of its annual programme of Public Hearings. These hearings allow Members to exchange views with experts concerning issues which fall with the areas of competence of the ITRE Committee. The digitalisation of the European manufacturing industry, in particular SMEs, is a crucial process in the modernisation and the competitiveness of European industries, as the EU seeks to

revitalise its industrial base and help its industries and SME's be more competitive internationally. The Committee has invited four experts to participate in the hearing, namely Prof. Catherine Ledig, Director of ADEC (Association for the Development of Enterprises and Competencies), Dr. Laurent Zibell, Policy Adviser at IndustriALL Trade Union, Prof. em. Dr. Hartmut Hirsch-Kreinsen, former Chair of the Economic and Industrial Sociology at the Faculty of Economics and Social Sciences of the TU Dortmund University and Mr. Manuel Gamella, Member of the Working Group in the Spanish labour union Comisiones Obreras for the study of new production models.
