- the need of a clear split in budgetary management of financing coming from the 2007-2013 and the one coming from 2014-2020 to be done by the JUs;

In addition to the amendments tabled to the draft reports, the TRAN Committee provided an opinion on the SESAR Joint Undertaking 2013 discharge.

The rapporteur proposes to postpone three discharges – Artemis, ENIAC and ITER.

51. COOPERATION AND VERIFICATION MECHANISM WITH REGARD TO BULGARIA AND ROMANIA - LATEST DEVELOPMENTS

Exchange of views

The Commission issued on 27 January 2016 its latest reports on steps taken by Bulgaria and Romania on judicial reform and fight against corruption and for the latter also on organised crime, in the context of the Cooperation and Verification Mechanism (CVM).

The report on Bulgaria sets out progress made against the established benchmarks in the past twelve months, and points out further steps needed. In relation to Romania, the report shows continued progress towards the goals of the CVM and indicates where further steps are needed.

The CONT Members will have an exchange of views in the presence of William Sleath, Head of Unit of EC responsible for the CVM.

revision of the code of conduct for Commissioners, the rules for expert groups and the possible renewal of tobacco agreements.

The English version of the 367 amendments tabled to the part I of the Commission discharge report was circulated to CONT Members on 16 March.

38 amendments to the part II of the report (concerning special reports of the ECA) were tabled and circulated on 9 March 2016.

Following the exchange of views with Commissioner Neven Mimica responsible for International Cooperation and Development and the Director General and Deputy Head of Operations of the European Investment Bank (EIB) for Operations outside the EU, Mr

Luca Lazzaroli on 1 December 2015, CONT had a discussion on the draft report on 23 February 2016.

The Rapporteur Ms Schmidt highlighted the following set of actions as being important to be implemented or closely monitored namely:

- (i) the implementation of the renewed development agenda by 2030 with a higher level of ambition in the strategy and priorities alongside an enhanced coordination among donors for the various aid instruments for the purpose of efficiency and effectiveness;
- (ii) a better combination of short and long term actions such as the swift design of a comprehensive crisis response on migration using with more flexibility EDF resources;
- (iii) the need for reinforcing the supervision of operations and the management assurance process especially when it comes to the accountability of Heads of Union delegations for their management, oversight and reporting duties;
- (iv) further monitoring of the levels of previous outstanding EDFs commitments ("Reste à Liquider");
- (v) an enhanced scrutiny by the Parliament on the use of EDFs funding in the perspective of the post 2020 Cotonou agreement.

Separate chapters are also dedicated to budget support presenting significant fiduciary risks, to the cooperation with international organisations particularly when pooling of funds are at stake, the evaluation of various Union's support to ACP countries on timber producing countries, for renewable energy in East Africa, for the fight against torture and the abolition of death penalty and the Union support to Haiti.

33 amendments were tabled to the draft report.

In addition to the amendments tabled, the Committee on Development (DEVE) delivered an opinion on this CONT draft report.

The Rapporteur Mr Czarnecki mentioned the following range of issues of the discharge report in relation to the effectiveness of the EEAS:

- (i) the existing imbalances between nationalities where progress can be observed but further improvements are still expected;
- (ii) the Heads of delegation duties for which the Rapporteur considered that the Head of delegations should give equal importance to the management of operations and the management of political issues;
- (iii) the integration of EU special representatives within the EEAS structure; and
- (iv) the whistleblowing procedures that should be applied in all the areas of foreign policies.

21 amendments were tabled to the draft report.

In addition to the amendments tabled, the Committee on Foreign Affairs (AFET) delivered an opinion on this CONT report.

56. FIGHT AGAINST CORRUPTION AND FOLLOW UP OF THE CRIM RESOLUTION

The opinion received 46 amendments that will be considered by Members.

The amendments consider a vast range of issues among which the urgency of tackling VAT fraud, particularly the cross-border VAT carousel fraud, within a fully functioning EPPO. Also Members ask for the creation of a common definition at EU level of organised crime, the establishment of a proper instrument for the exchange of banking information and show concern with the professionalism of smugglers. The EU should give more attention to the fighting against corruption in public procurement and to the existing tax havens, and continue encouraging transparency procedures to face corruption and fraudulent activities. Some compromise amendments are possibly envisaged.

The opinion will be voted in CONT on 20 April to integrate the report in LIBE to be adopted in May.

60. THE ACTIVITIES, IMPACT AND ADDED VALUE OF THE EUROPEAN GLOBALIZATION ADJUSTMENT FUND BETWEEN 2007 AND 2014



Consideration of draft opinion

Rapporteur: <u>Marco Valli</u> (EFDD) Administrator: Hrvoje Svetic Main Committee: EMPL

The CONT committee is giving an opinion to the EMPL committee on the activities, impact and added value of the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund (EGF) between 2007 and 2014;

The EGF was established in 2006 to show EU solidarity towards workers affected by mass redundancies as a result of globalisation, and amended in 2009 to enable it also to help workers made redundant as a result of the global financial and economic crisis. The EGF should facilitate the reintegration into employment of those workers by providing financial contributions for time limited and coordinated packages of personalised services. Such packages include active labour market measures such as training, aid for self-employment, coaching and outplacement. The rules governing the EGF were amended first by Regulation (EC) No 546/2009 and, since January 2014, by Regulation (EU) No 1309/2013.

The Rapporteur noted that in some cases not all workers formerly employed by the suppliers of an affected enterprise were included in the EGF support. He pointed out that all measures under the EGF regulation may also be applied under the European Social Fund (ESF), as well as that certain Member States prefer to deploy the ESF rather that the EGF due to the higher co-financing rate of the ESF, its quicker implementation, the lack of EGF pre-financing and the EGF's lengthy approval procedure. Moreover, the quality and availability of reintegration data was found to be adversely affected by a variety of different factors, and the Member State authorities generally did not distinguish between active labour marked measures such as training and aid for self-employment and the income support for paid workers.

The Rapporteur stressed that it has been difficult to clearly evaluate the success of the instrument and its real contribution as single instrument to the reintegration of workers, and considered that the EGF should be able to provide its financial contribution rapidly in order to maximise its impact and to allow the affected workers to benefit from the funded measures at the earliest after having been made redundant.

The proposal, pursuant to Article 325 of the Treaty, aims at remedying a punctual weakness in the OLAF regulation and is therefore limited in scope: The

proposal aims that the Supervisory Committee of the European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF-SC) be provided by the Commission and that the appropriations for the Supervisory Committee and its secretariat be entered into the section of the general budget of the European Union relating to the Commission.

Given the limited scope of the proposal and given the fact that the proposal corresponds to long standing demands made by Parliament and the OLAF-SC itself, the Council and the Parliament envisage a swift adoption of the proposal.
