1. Chair's announcements

1.1 Interpretation

1.2.1 Request to apply Rule 54 to the FEMM Committee Own-Initiative Report entitled "The Need for an EU strategy to end and prevent the Gender Pension Gap" (PR)

(See also item 4.7).

Decision

The Coordinators instructed the Chair to negotiate a Rule 54 agreement to be sent to the CCC.

1.2.2 Request for the application of the procedure with associated committees (Rule 54) with regard to the Strategic Own-Initiative Report by TRAN Committee on "An Aviation Strategy for Europe" (CO)

AND

1.2.3 Request by TRAN to apply Rule 54 to the Balas report on *Social Dumping* (BM)

Annex to this item included

- the EMPL letter to the TRAN Chair and
- the TRAN letter to the EMPL Chair
- the EMPL letter to the TRAN chair dated 9 March

TRAN Coordinators discussed this issue on 14 March and endorsed the compromise suggested in the EMPL letter dated 9 March.

Decision

- noted that the TRAN Coordinators accepted that settlement on 15 March 2016
- agreed that the EMPL competences in relation to employment and social matters in transport should be safeguarded.

1.2.4 Request by EMPL to apply Rule 54 to the TRAN report on the Postal Services Directive (PR)

Decision

The Coordinators

- expressed the hope that EMPL since the TRAN report had been authorised by the CoP on 14 January without granting a specific status to EMPL may count on reciprocal fairness of the TRAN Committee to apply an informal cooperation arrangement (see item 1.2.3. above);
- instructed the Chair to negotiate and finalise an agreement with TRAN.
- 1.2.5 Establishment of the Structural Reform Support Programme for the period 2017 to 2020 and amending Regulations (EU) No 1303/2013 and (EU) No 1305/2013 (REGI) (MA)

Decision

The Coordinators noted that

- EMPL had insisted on the application of Rule 54 and that
- the CCC would prepare a recommendation, which will be most likely on the agenda of the meeting of the Conference of Presidents of 7 April 2016.
- 1.2.6 Approximation of the laws, regulations and administrative provisions of the Member States as regards the accessibility requirements for products and services ("Accessibility Act" IMCO) (MA)

Following a letter of 8 February 2016 by the EMPL Chair requesting the application of the procedure with joint committee meetings (Rule 55), the issue was put on the agenda of the meeting of the CCC of 8 March 2016 for a decision without discussion. The CCC decided to:

- urge the committee Chairs to meet and to try to find an agreement, if necessary with the assistance of the CCC Chair;
- set a deadline of 18 March 2016 by which an agreement should be reached;
- (should no agreement be reached by that date) charge its Chair to make a recommendation to the Conference of Presidents, based on Annex VI to the Rules of Procedure.

The Coordinators took note of the fact that in the absence of an agreement both committees had to await the decision of CCC Chair.

The Coordinators instructed the secretariat, acting under the authority of the Chair, to explore modalities for EMPL and CONT to work together on a report on the implementation of the Youth Guarantee and the Youth Employment Initiative within their specific competences.

4.3 Recognition of professional qualifications in inland navigation(MG)

Responsible: TRAN Opinions: JURI, IMCO, EMPL

EMPL/8/05830

***I 2016/0050(COD) COM(2016)0082 - C8-0061/2016

Observations: The objective of the initiative is to facilitate labour mobility in the inland waterway transport sector by ensuring that skilled workers' qualifications are recognised throughout the Union. The initiative builds upon over 19 years of experience with implementation of Directives 96/50/EC and 91/672/EEC which are however limited to the mutual recognition of boatmasters operating on EU inland waterways other than the Rhine river. The initiative responds to long-standing calls from the sector and Member States to revise the existing outdated legal framework and replace it with a modern, competence-based framework in line with the approach towards recognition of qualifications for other modes of transport.

The Commission proposal includes a chapter on Certification of professional qualifications (Chapter 3), and especially its section II on Competences, Article 15 on Assessment of competences and Article 17 on Approval of training programmes, that are directly related to EMPL responsibilities on vocational training policy, including professional qualifications.

1. Any Member may table a motion for a resolution on a matter falling within the spheres of activity of the European Union. The motion may not comprise more than 200 words.

It may combine the motion for a resolution with other motions for resolutions or reports.

It may adopt an opinion, which may take the form of a letter.

It may decide to draw up a report under Rule 52.

3. The authors of a motion for a resolution shall be informed of the decisions of the committee and of the Conference of Presidents.

4. The report shall contain the text of the motion for a resolution.

- 5. Opinions in the form of a letter addressed to other institutions of the European Union shall be forwarded by the President.
- 6. The author or authors of a motion for a resolution tabled under Rule 123(2), 128(5) or 135(2) shall be entitled to withdraw it before the final vote.
- 7. A motion for a resolution tabled in accordance with paragraph 1 may be withdrawn by its author, authors or first signatory before the committee responsible has decided, in accordance with paragraph 2, to draw up a report on it.

Once the motion has been thus taken over by the committee, only the committee shall be empowered to withdraw it up until the opening of the final vote.

8. A withdrawn motion for a resolution may be taken over and retabled immediately by a group, a committee or the same number of Members as is entitled to table it.

Committees have a duty to ensure that motions for resolutions tabled under this Rule which meet the requirements laid down are followed up and duly referred to in the resulting documents.
