88. *Stresses that this instrument will from now on enable the Union to fund training measures for and the supply of non-lethal equipment (such as IT systems, hospitals, etc.) to third-country armed forces in order to meet urgent, short- and medium-term needs, as part of the efforts to achieve sustainable development objectives;*

88. *Believes that the post-2020 IcSP regulation should not include the military component of the Capacity Building in support of Security and Development (CBSD) assistance offered to partner countries, as doing so would politically weaken the EU's only instrument for civilian conflict prevention; recalls as well that CBSD funding under the current IcSP is not in compliance with either Article 209 of the TFEU, relevant case-law of the ECJ or the limits on military spending imposed by Article 41(2) of the TEU;*

88a. Calls on the Commission and the EEAS to retain a single, dedicated instrument for civilian conflict prevention and rapid civilian crisis response by maintaining the IcSP as a separate instrument in the post-2020 architecture; stresses that the preservation of the IcSP is crucial to ensuring the Union's credibility, in particular as regards its commitment to peace and security; urges the Commission and the EEAS to take into account the growing demand for civilian conflict prevention in the EU's neighbourhood by tripling the funds available for such action, in particular by financing initiatives in the fields of mediation, dialogue and reconciliation; stresses that such an increase should not be at the expense of civilian conflict prevention and peacebuilding in other regions;
