




- having regard to the Commission proposal to Parliament and the Council (COM(2023)0124),

- having regard to Article 294(3) of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

- after consulting the Committee of the Regions;
- having regard to the undertaking given by the Council representative by letter of 5 April 2023 to approve Parliament's position, in accordance with Article 294(4) of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,
- having regard to Rule 59 of its Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the letter from the Committee on Fisheries,
- having regard to the joint deliberations of the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Food Safety and the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development under Rule 58 of the Rules of Procedure,
- having regard to the report of the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Food Safety and the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development (A9-0168/2023),

Dear Chairs,

Under the procedure referred to in subject, the Committee on Fisheries was referred to "for opinion": however, considering the tight timeframe and the proposal at stake, PECH Coordinators decided to provide this opinion in the form of a letter, pursuant to Rule 56(1) second subparagraph. The Committee on Fisheries adopted this opinion at its meeting¹ of 26 April 2023.

The Committee on Fisheries believes the full implementation of the Withdrawal Agreement and the Trade and Cooperation Agreement is of upmost importance, and underlines the necessity to prepare and anticipate future negotiations with the UK.

The proposed regulation notably provides for new arrangements and specific measures on fishery products, in order to protect EU consumers. It also aims at preventing the risk that fishery products may originate from illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing (IUU) and reach the EU Internal market without being subject to the certification requirements and procedures laid down in the IUU Regulation (No 1005/2008).

On behalf of the Committee on Fisheries, and in association with Mr François Xavier Bellamy, the PECH standing rapporteur for post-Brexit matters, I hereby convey the opinion of the Committee on Fisheries, confirming that the proposed Regulation be adopted without any change as far as the provisions concerning fisheries and aquaculture products are concerned.

The Committee on Fisheries also underlines the need to give all necessary attention to the proper implementation and respect of these new arrangements with the United Kingdom, to ensure that fisheries goods intended for retail sale in Northern Ireland and subject to these simplified arrangements will not be subsequently moved into a Member State.
