

SHORT JUSTIFICATION

The Commission has presented to the European Parliament and the Council a proposal for a Decision on a Union Civil Protection Mechanism, aimed at strengthening EU capacities to prevent and respond to disasters, both within and outside the EU territory.

The Committee on Foreign Affairs broadly supports the general approach of the proposal which consists in transforming the current ad-hoc system into pre-planned disaster management, while respecting the leading role and primary responsibility of Member States in civil protection.

Furthermore, the Committee on Foreign Affairs welcomes the increased focus on prevention and preparedness and highlights the importance of shared risk assessment and contingency planning. It stresses the need to ensure consistency with the forthcoming implementation of the Solidarity Clause.

Finally, the Committee points out to the need to reach adequate balance between the imperative of rapid response on the one hand, and coherence of EU external relations on the other.

AMENDMENTS

The Committee on Foreign Affairs calls on the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Food Safety, as the committee responsible, to incorporate the following amendments in its report:
