## European Parliament resolution on the accident at the AZF plant in Toulouse

The European Parliament,

- A. whereas the explosion at the AZF plant in Toulouse killed 29 people and injured more than 2000 others,
- B. whereas this highly dangerous plant is located in a densely populated urban area,
- 1. Expresses its sympathy with the families of the victims;
- 2. Calls for full light to be shed on the real circumstances of this tragedy, without excluding the possibility of criminal, or even terrorist, involvement;
- 3. Calls for all those responsible for the circumstances which led to this disaster to be held to account not only the firms concerned but also the municipal and national authorities;
- 4. Calls on the European Union to demonstrate it solidarity with those affected by releasing emergency aid, as it has done to help regions hit by natural disasters;
- 5. Notes the ineffectiveness and pointlessness of the European Union's environmental protection policy, in particular the 'Seveso' directives;
- 3. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission and Council.
