European Parliament resolution on the situation in Somalia

The European Parliament,

- A. whereas, following the unification of the two former Italian and British colonies in 1960, Somalia experienced many years of military dictatorship and civil war,
- B. whereas in 1991 the Somali National Movement unilaterally proclaimed the foundation of an independent republic, Somaliland, in the north of the country; whereas in 1998 Puntland, a regional state in the south of the country comprising five areas of the former Somalia, was formed; whereas, at present, these are the only autonomous regional entities in which legislative, executive and judicial powers are separated,
- C. whereas, in August 2000, the Djibouti Conference should have disbanded the former Somali Democratic Republic to create a new form of peaceful government; whereas, however, the conference was manipulated by former 'warlords' and took place without Somalia being democratically represented; whereas the commitment to reconciliation based on a 'bottom-up approach' that had UN support has not been honoured,
- D. whereas, in the early 1990s, the Al-Ittihād armed Islamic group was formed in Somalia and several links between the warlords and Islamic terrorism aimed at transforming Somalia into a fundamental Islamic state were brought to light,
- E. whereas, as part of their international fight against terrorism, the United States have repeatedly pointed to links between the Al-Qa'ida terrorist organisation and Al-Ittihād through commercial and financial enterprises and militia recruitment in Somalia,
- 1. Calls on the Commission to support the convening of a meeting between representatives of the regional communities with a view to initiating a broad-based political dialogue aimed at securing a general improvement in the political situation in Somalia;
- 2. Calls on the Commission to contribute to finding a solution to the present situation in Somalia by fostering, *inter alia*, the establishment of a central federal state based on regional entities, which are currently the sole bodies capable of giving free expression to the needs and aspirations of the civilian population of Somalia,
- 3. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council, the governments of the Member States, the government of Somalia, and the States of Puntland and Somaliland.
