#### European Parliament resolution on the dialogue between the People's Republic of China's government and the Dalai Lama's envoys

### The European Parliament,

- having regard to the previous five rounds of dialogue between the government of the People's Republic of China and Envoys of the Dalai Lama, launched in September 2002,

- having regard to its previous resolution on Tibet,

- having regard to Rule 115(5) of its Rules of Procedure,

A. welcoming the commitment of the government of the People's Republic of China and the Dalai Lama to resolve the Tibet question through a process of dialogue,

B. taking note of the concerns of the government of the People's Republic of China for the unity and stability of China as well as of the European Union's adherence to a 'one China' policy, which recognises the Tibet Autonomous Region and Tibetan autonomous prefectures and counties to be a part of the People's Republic of China,

C. highlighting the Dalai Lama's statements that he is not seeking independence but an autonomy for Tibet that respects the territorial integrity and Constitution of the People's Republic of China,

1. Urges the government of the People's Republic of China and the Dalai Lama's envoys to continue and resume the dialogue without preconditions in order to find a pragmatic solution that respects the territorial integrity of the PRC and fulfils the aspirations of the Tibetan people;

2. Welcomes the laws and regulations on regional ethnic autonomy adopted by the government of the People's Republic of China;

3. Calls on the Commission, the Council and the Member States to actively support the strengthening of the dialogue;

4. Calls on the EU Presidency to do its outmost to facilitate the discussions towards a peaceful and negotiated solution for Tibet;

5. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission, the President and Prime Minister of the People's Republic of China and the Dalai Lama.
