Motion for a European Parliament resolution on urgent solidarity with Ukraine

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Russian Government’s recognition of the separatist Luhansk People’s Republic and Donetsk People’s Republic and its invasion of Ukraine,
 - having regard to Belarus’s continuous hybrid warfare operations, utilising migrants as human ammunition against EU Member States,
 - having regard to Rule 143 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas the EU’s energy policies have increased its dependency on Russian energy exports;
- B. whereas Member States have been reluctant to prioritise investment in their defence capabilities following the end of the Cold War;
1. Welcomes an immediate evaluation and reassessment of all aspects of EU-Russia relations;
 2. Calls on the Commission and all Member States to act swiftly in support of those defending European values from Russian aggression;
 3. Calls on the Commission to urgently propose punitive sanctions against Russia;
 4. Calls on the Commission to present proposals without delay to fully utilise the capacity of the European Peace Facility in order to provide military materiel for the Ukrainian resistance, including platforms designed to deliver lethal force;
 5. Calls on the Commission to reassess its policy with regard to the EU’s financing of its physical borders.
