Motion for a European Parliament resolution on placing the Antifa movement on the EU terrorist list

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Council Common Position of 27 December 2001 on the application of specific measures to combat terrorism (2001/931/CFSP)¹,
- having regard to Council Decision (CFSP) 2020/20 of 13 January 2020 updating the list of persons, groups and entities subject to Articles 2, 3 and 4 of Common Position 2001/931/CFSP on the application of specific measures to combat terrorism, and repealing Decision (CFSP) 2019/1341²,
- having regard to Rule 143 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas Antifa continue to commit violence in Europe and the USA, supressing the freedom of thought and expression in Europe, using 'hit-lists' and other repressive measures, whereas Antifa allegedly received training from other terrorist groups in Syria; whereas the latest assaults with lethal intent was carried out by Antifa both in Budapest, Hungary assaulting civilians and later in Germany leaving more the 50 police officers injured;
- 1. Calls on the High Representative and the EU Council to ensure that Antifa is included in the EU terrorist list.
