# Motion for a European Parliament resolution on the need to abolish the European Economic and Social Committee

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the Treaty of Rome of 1957,
- having regard to the Treaty of Maastricht of 1992,
- having regard to the Treaty of Lisbon of 2007,
- having regard to Rule 143 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas the European Economic and Social Committee (EESC) was set up in 1958 to allow civil society organisations to influence EU policy;
- B. whereas Parliament and other EU bodies now interact directly with civil society organisations;
- C. whereas there is no evidence of how the EESC has helped to shape EU policy;
- D. whereas the EESC issued only 131 non-binding opinions in 2020, yet employs almost 700 permanent staff members and costs around EUR 150 million of taxpayers' money annually;
- E. whereas German Federal Parliament member Katharina Willkomm (FDP), former MEP Derk Jan Eppink and current MEP Tomáš Zdechovský (EPP) have underlined the EESC's uselessness;
- 1. Underlines the complete lack of added value provided by the EESC;
- 2. Underlines the EESC's call to increase its budget;
- 3. Calls on the Council, the Commission and the Member States to abolish the EESC.
