

on the proposal for a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing a common organisation of the markets in agricultural products (Single CMO Regulation)

(COM(2011)0626 - C7-0339/2011 - 2011/0281(COD))

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SHORT JUSTIFICATION

The common organisation of the markets within the CAP remains a vital part and constitutes a high priority in the current reform. The reform tries to outline the way forward for the individual market organization of the CAP, such as sugar, wine, olive oil etc. The proposals try to address all sectors of the CAP and that the financial interests of the Union will be upheld.

As the CAP grew more complex over the years, better regulation and a significant reduction of bureaucracy to farmers needs to be an important component of the future CAP. Any unjustified and excessive administrative burden and cost to national authorities should be avoided, especially in the light of fiscal consolidation by the Member States and the scarcity of resources. Targeted spending is required in order to ensure a sound management of the Union funds towards the delivery of crucial public goods through the multifunctional CAP.

The aim of the proposal of the Commission is to lay down a sector specific policy by addressing all individual sectors. In addition, the proposals refer to market intervention and private storage issues as well as the use of export refunds. The questions of producer organisations and producer groups, especially in the fruit and vegetable sector, together with promotion schemes and labelling practices have been addressed. Policy options are given for the sectors in order to respond to the future challenges for agriculture areas and to meet the objectives set for the CAP. The reform has to also take into account the new marketing, productions and quality package standards (e.g. milk quotas), in order to provide an efficient framework and a system able to avoid the high volatility of prices.

It is of paramount importance to ensure compliance with the requirements of public interest linked to the granting of payments.

This report has been based on the aggregate financial amounts, which the Commission has earmarked for the CAP within the next multiannual financial framework. Should fundamental changes be made to that proposal, the substance of this opinion would need to be revised.

AMENDMENTS

The Committee on Budgets calls on the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development, as the committee responsible, to incorporate the following amendments in its report:

Amendment 1

Proposal for a regulation Article 31 – paragraph 1 – subparagraph 1 – point e

Text proposed by the Commission

Amendment

(e) environmental measures and methods of production respecting the environment, including organic farming; (e) environmental measures and methods of production respecting the environment, including organic farming *and integrated production*;

Justification

As a production method that integrates as many natural resources and mechanisms as possible, 'integrated production' guarantees a type of farming that is sustainable in the long term. For this reason and because this method can be applied to virtually all crops, it should be treated as an environmental practice that is accepted by the Union in relation to agricultural products.

Amendment 2

Proposal for a regulation Article 32 – paragraph 1

Text proposed by the Commission

1. The Union financial assistance shall be equal to the amount of the financial contributions referred to in point (a) of Article 30(1) as actually paid and limited to 50 % of the actual expenditure incurred.
