

SHORT JUSTIFICATION

The Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Community and the Republic of Guinea-Bissau¹ entered into force on 15 April 2008. The Commission conducted negotiations with the Government of the Republic of Guinea-Bissau resulting in a new protocol which was initialled on 15 November 2018 and repeals the previous protocol, which had expired on 23 November 2017.

The new Protocol provides fishing opportunities for Union vessels in Guinea-Bissau waters, on the basis of the best available scientific advice and following the recommendations of the International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT). This new Protocol takes into account the results of an evaluation of the previous Protocol (2014-2017) and of a forward-looking assessment of whether a new Protocol should be concluded. Both were carried out by external experts. The Protocol will also enable the European Union and the Republic of Guinea-Bissau to work more closely on promoting sound exploitation of fishery resources in Guinea-Bissau waters and to support efforts by Guinea-Bissau to develop its blue economy, in the interests of both parties.

The Protocol provides for fishing opportunities in the following categories:

- (a) shrimp freezer trawlers;
- (b) fin-fish and cephalopod freezer trawlers;
- (c) small pelagic trawlers;
- (d) tuna freezer seiners and longliners;
- (e) pole-and-line tuna vessels.

For the first three categories, fishing opportunities are expressed in terms of fishing effort for the first two years and in terms of catch limit for the last three years.

The negotiation of a new protocol to the Fisheries Partnership Agreement with Guinea-Bissau forms part of the Union's external action in relation to ACP countries and takes into account, in particular, Union objectives on respecting democratic principles and human rights. The Protocol covers a period of five years from the date of its provisional application.

The annual financial contribution from the European Union is EUR 15 600 000, based on:

- an annual amount for access to fishery resources for the categories provided for in the Protocol, set at EUR 11 600 000 per year for the entire duration of the Protocol;
- support for the development of the sectoral fisheries policy and the blue economy of Guinea-Bissau for an amount of EUR 4 000 000 per year for the entire duration of the Protocol. This support meets the objectives of Guinea-Bissau's national policy on the sustainable management of its continental and maritime fishery resources for the entire duration of the Protocol.

This shall contribute to the implementation of the national strategy for fisheries and the blue economy. It aims to support the sustainable management of fishery resources and the development of the sector, in particular by: - strengthening: (i) the monitoring, control and surveillance of fishing activities (including by putting in place the Electronic Reporting

System ERS and ensuring it is operational); (ii) the collection and processing of data for scientific purposes and the capacity to analyse and assess fishery resources and fisheries; (iii) the capacity of operators in the fisheries sector; (iv) international cooperation; - supporting small-scale fishing; improving the conditions for exporting fishery products and promoting investment in the sector; developing infrastructure relevant to fisheries; supporting the blue economy and developing aquaculture.

The annual amount for commitment and payment appropriations is established during the annual budgetary procedure, including for the reserve line for protocols not having entered into force at the beginning of the year².

The Commission would be authorised to approve, on behalf of the Union, the amendments to the Protocol to be adopted by the Joint Committee set up under the Partnership Agreement.

The Committee on Budgets calls on the Committee on Fisheries, as the committee responsible, to recommend that Parliament give its consent to the draft Council decision on the conclusion of the Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Community and the Republic of Guinea-Bissau and of the Protocol on the implementation of that Partnership Agreement.
