In the early 2010s, farmers in some EU Member States significantly increased their milk production, taking advantage of higher prices which peaked at the beginning of 2014. In August 2014, the Russian Federation banned dairy products from Member States in response to EU sanctions over Ukraine.

The EU common agricultural policy (CAP) provides mechanisms that mitigate such situations, including direct payments to stabilise farmers' income, market intervention measures known as the 'safety net' to support prices by temporarily removing surpluses, and exceptional measures to counter market disturbances.

The auditors concluded that the European Commission reacted rapidly to the Russian ban. But the auditors also noted that the Commission took longer to address underlying market imbalances. Despite the income stabilisation effect of direct payments, milk producers can face cash-flow issues following a sudden price fall. The Commission sought to address this issue, but it did not assess the scale of dairy farms' cash-flow difficulties.

The ECA recommends the Commission to update its procedures for tackling market imbalances so that it will first check whether conditions attached to CAP contribute to oversupply and also to make the use of public funds more efficient by analysing the impact of market disturbances and existing support and linking exceptional support to clear targets.

The Commission opted in 2011 to mainstream climate into the EU budget (“climate mainstreaming”). This involved integrating mitigation and adaptation measures (“climate action”) into EU policies. The Commission attributed over EUR 100 billion of the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) funds during the 2014-2020 period to tackle climate change (almost 26 % of the CAP budget). In this Special Report, the ECA verifies whether the 2014-2020 CAP indeed supported climate mitigation practices with a potential to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and if such practices were better incentivised than in the 2007-2013 period.

The ECA’s work focused on the main sources of greenhouse gas emissions from agriculture: livestock and manure storage; application of chemical fertilisers and manure, and; land use (cultivation of organic soils and conversion of grassland and cropland).

Audit findings suggest that the changes in the 2014-2020 CAP did not reflect the new climate ambitions. The ECA found that the CAP funds attributed to climate action had little impact on such emissions: livestock emission did not decrease between 2010 and 2018; greenhouse gas emissions from the use of chemical fertilisers and manure increased between 2010 and 2018, and CAP provided little or no support to mitigation practices to be adopted in the use of land. The CAP mostly finances measures with a low potential to mitigate climate change. The CAP does not seek to limit or reduce livestock (50 % of agriculture emissions) and supports farmers who cultivate drained peatlands (20 % of emissions).



Based on its assessment, the ECA recommends the Commission to take action to reduce emissions from agriculture and from cultivated drained organic soils and to set-up a reporting tool allowing regular monitoring of CAP’s contribution to climate mitigation. The ECA also invokes the application of the “polluter pays” principle to agriculture. The Commission partially accepts the ECA recommendations.

ECA Member Viorel Ștefan will present the ECA Special Report on the polluter pays principle, one of the key principles underlying the European Union's environmental policy. The principle requires that polluters should bear the costs of their pollution. The report focuses on whether the principle was well applied in four EU environmental policy areas: industrial pollution, waste, water, and soil. The ECA assessed whether the Commission's actions related to the Environmental Liability Directive for regulating environmental damage from economic activity brought results and whether the Commission and Member States protected the EU budget from being used to bear expenses that polluters should have paid. Over the 2014-2020 period, the planned EU budget on cohesion policy and the LIFE Programme amounts to about EUR 29 billion on projects aimed specifically at protecting the environment. The ECA examined EU spending and action concerning the 2014-2020 Multiannual Financial Framework. The ECA found that while the principle is generally reflected in the EU's environmental policies, its coverage remains incomplete and it is applied unevenly across sectors and Member States. The auditors point out that, as a result, public money – instead of polluters' – is sometimes used to fund clean-up actions. With regards to environmental liability, the Commission's actions to support Member States' implementation of the Environmental Liability Directive had not solved key weaknesses, such as unclear key concepts and definitions and the absence of financial security in cases of insolvency. The EU budget is sometimes used to fund clean-up actions that should under the Polluter Pays Principle have been borne by polluters.

According to the OECD, corruption will be a major hurdle to achieving the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda. Corruption is a severe impediment to sustainable economic, political and social progress for countries at all levels of development. Corruption is also an aggravating factor in crisis - corruption and emergencies feed off each other, creating a vicious cycle of mismanagement, abuse and deeper crisis.

The COVID-19 pandemic was seen by some as an opportunity to take advantage of the emergency to abuse their power for private gain. A wave of corruption-related incidents linked to the current situation underscores the importance of continuing and strengthening transparency and accountability efforts. In many countries, responses to COVID-19 have seen breaches of anti-corruption standards such as cutting corners in procurement processes.

Curbing corruption requires government ownership of reforms, international cooperation, and a joint effort with civil society and the private sector. The Lisbon Treaty took the direction of reinforcing the role of the European Parliament, to bring about more coherence and democratic accountability. This draft report proposes concrete measures regarding the design, promotion and implementation of better anti-corruption policies.

In the 2019 Commission discharge, the European Parliament expressed its concern about the hate speech and violence taught in Palestinian school textbooks and used in schools by UNRWA, insisting that the earmarking of EU funding such as PEGASE for salaries paid to teachers and public servants in the education sector must be made conditional on educational material and course content complying with UNESCO standards of peace, tolerance, coexistence, and non-violence.

The Commission launched a study of Palestinian textbooks on the basis of these UNESCO-defined criteria. The study, carried out by the Georg Eckert Institute for International Textbook Research (GEI), provides a comprehensive and objective analysis of current textbooks with regards to these international education standards.

The GEI will present its conclusions, and the Commission (DG NEAR) and the European External Action Service (EEAS) will further present the topic and answer questions.
