- A. having regard to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights adopted and proclaimed by General Assembly resolution 217 A (III) of 10 December 1948,
- B. having regard to the declaration by the presidency on behalf of the European Union on human rights in Syria (11416/02) released on 8 August 2002,
- C. having regard to its resolution on the situation with regard to democratic rights in Syria, and the case of Riad Turk in particular (P5 TA(2002)0330), adopted on 13.06.2002,
- D. having regard to the fact that the Kurdish population of Syria (who after all account for 13% of the total population) have been continuously subjected to human rights abuses since the 'special census' of 1962 after which they were stripped of Syrian nationality,
- 1. Calls on the Syrian government:
- to reinstate Kurds as Syrian citizens with all associated rights, with retroactive effect;
- to recognise all the political and cultural rights of the Kurdish minority, and to allow them access to all educational establishments and courses of study;
- 2. Calls on the Council and the Commission:
- to express their concern about the situation of the Kurdish minority and to urge the Syrian government to urgently proceed with the necessary reforms;
- to emphasise towards Syria the importance of the respect for human rights mutually accepted in the Barcelona Declaration;
- to monitor closely the situation of the Kurdish minority, in particular in the context of the future Association Agreement.
