Written declaration on Commissioner Louis Michel's intention to use resources earmarked for development cooperation for military purposes

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Rule 116 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas Louis Michel, the Commissioner responsible for development cooperation, launched the idea in March 2005 of using EU development aid for training armed forces in Africa,
- B. whereas several specialised non-governmental organisations state that integrating military assistance into development aid will lead to funds intended for health and education projects being diverted into the purchase of arms,
- C. whereas providing funds for armed services certainly does not meet the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's policy criteria for combating poverty,
- D. whereas Louis Michel, as Belgian Minister for Foreign Affairs, intervened in order to ensure the issuing of licences for certain controversial arms exports by the Walloon factory FN,
- E. whereas Louis Michel shifted the focus of Belgian development cooperation to Africa, and whereas the Walloon arms industry has fully reaped the benefits of this shift,
- 1. Calls on the Commission to see to it that Louis Michel's line of thinking is not pursued;
- 2. Instructs its President to forward this declaration, together with the names of the signatories, to the Commission and the governments and parliaments of the Member States and the candidate countries
