Written declaration on discrimination against trade union members on the basis of their political preferences in Belgium

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Rule 116 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas in certain Member States, including Belgium, trade unions perform a number of tasks on behalf of the State (such as paying unemployment benefits), in return for which they are reimbursed with taxpayers' money,
- B. whereas membership of a trade union therefore constitutes a practical advantage in terms of obtaining certain social rights,
- 1. Notes that hundreds of people, particularly in Belgium, have been expelled from their trade union for standing as candidates on an election list submitted by the opposition party Vlaams Belang;
- 2. Condemns this discrimination on the basis of political preference as contravening Article 14 of the European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR);
- 3. Urges the Commission to investigate this situation and to remind the Belgian Federal Government of its responsibilities;
- 4. Instructs its President to forward this declaration, together with the names of the signatories, to the Commission and the Belgian Federal Government.
