Written declaration on the statements by members of the Commission concerning internal political developments in the Member State Belgium

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Rule 116 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas some members of the Commission have expressed the fear that a possible splitting-up of Belgium could have a 'contaminative effect' on other European regions, such as the Basque country and Catalonia,
- B. whereas the head of the Commission's representation in Belgium has stated that some French-speaking Europeans in the 'Flemish Belt' around Brussels fear the impact of a split on their everyday lives and fear for the survival of the arrangements which exist for linguistic minorities,
- 1. Considers that the European Union consists of national democracies and that the European institutions have a duty to respect the internal political, constitutional and legislative developments which result from free, fair and secret elections in the individual Member States;
- 2. Stresses in this respect that both members of the Commission itself and their subordinate officials have a duty to maintain political neutrality and must refrain from making political comments and statements about internal political developments in a Member State;
- 3. Instructs its President to forward this declaration, together with the names of the signatories, to the Council and Commission.
