Written declaration, under Rule 136 of Parliament's Rules of Procedure, on the protection of the UNESCO sites in Europe¹

- 1. The United Nation Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) awards recognition to the territories that comply with specific requirements, and bind themselves to strict rules.
- 2. The recognition of sites listed under the World Heritage List (WHL) is an important factor that contributes to the promotion and protection of important tourist sites across Europe and beyond.
- 3. The stakeholders of UNESCO sites invest in culture because of the increased awareness of the assets held.
- 4. Being included on the WHL narrows the range of political options for local administrations, as the rules are binding and land consumption has to be reduced.
- 5. The Commission is called upon to develop guidelines and provide specific support to European regions and cities who try to receive the recognition of a site in the WHL.
- 6. The Commission is called upon to institute a European UNESCO Sites Day.
- 7. This declaration, together with the names of the signatories, is forwarded to the Council and the Commission.

¹ Under Rule 136(4) and (5) of Parliament's Rules of Procedure, where a declaration is signed by a majority of Parliament's component Members, it is published in the minutes with the names of its signatories and forwarded to the addressees, without however binding Parliament.
