Subject: Appointment of senior Council officials

In 1999 and 2000, the European Commission laid down a number of guidelines for the appointment and career development of its senior officials. These rules include the following principles:

- Merit must be the dominant criterion for decisions on senior appointments;
- The career advancement of A1 and A2 officials must take due account of the results of regular performance appraisals;
- As a general rule, A1 and A2 officials are subject to mobility after 5 years and cannot normally stay in a post for more than 7 years;
- A1 posts are generally opened up to competition.
- 1. What rules does the Council apply to the appointment and career development of its senior officials?
- 2. How many A1 and A2 officials does the Council employ? How many are women? How many belong to ethnic minorities?
- 3. How many current A1 and A2 Council officials have been in their post for 5 years or more? How many have been in their post for 7 years or more?
- 4. How many open competitions have been held since 1999 for the replacement of A1 and A2 officials?
- 5. Does the Council plan to hold open competitions for future vacancies at A1 and A2 level? If not, why not?
