WRITTEN QUESTION E-2240/03 by Bartho Pronk (PPE-DE) to the Commission

Subject: Follow-up to an application for a driving licence in another EU Member State

On 15 May 2003 the Commission answered my Written Question E-1269/03<sup>1</sup>. However, the answer is incomplete. The Commission acknowledges that some applicants may not meet the 185-day requirement in any Member State, but fails to deal with the second part of my question, namely what steps individuals and Member States should take in such a case.

1. In the situation outlined above, what should citizens and Member States do in order to comply with what the Commission sees as the clear requirement laid down in Directive 91/439/EEC<sup>2</sup>?

2. If a question consists of three parts, would it not be better for the Commission to answer each part separately, so as to ensure that none is forgotten?
