Subject: Enlistment of doctors on passenger ships

With reference to a tragic event that occurred recently in Greece - namely the death of a ferry boat passenger in December 2006, I would like to ask the Commission the following questions:

- Should it not be made obligatory, in the case of vessels that undertake long voyages (including a night at sea) and carry large numbers of passengers on each voyage, for there to be a doctor on board?
- What does the relevant European legislation stipulate?
- If nothing has been laid down as yet, will the Commission not consider bringing forward a proposal on this matter that makes it obligatory for doctors to be enlisted on vessels that undertake long voyages, based on passenger numbers, the incidents that have arisen to date be they minor or a man's death and the fact that the presence of a doctor on those vessels would improve the services provided, as well as passenger safety, and could save lives?
