Subject: Sale of military aircraft by Czech Republic to Bolivia; violation of EU code of conduct

The Czech Republic and Bolivia are currently negotiating for the sale of 10 military training aircraft (AERO L-159A). The aircraft are part of a military surplus that the Czech armed forces hope to sell off after dissolution of the Czechoslovakian army.

- 1. Has this issue been discussed in the COARM (EU working party on arms)?
- 2. Has the Czech Government explained to the other EU Member States how it believes such a sale to be in harmony with the EU Code of Conduct on Arms Exports in the perspective of the bad human rights situation in Bolivia?
- 3. What action will the Council to prevent future so called 'military surplus sales' being conducted with countries which are prone to armed conflict and where human rights are violated on a daily basis?
- 4. What efforts will the Council undertake to convince the Czech Government to issue a denial of this particular deal with Bolivia?
