Subject: CIA's secret detentions and illegal transfers in Greece

In its resolution P6_TA(2007)0032 of 14 February 2007¹, the European Parliament 'Notes the 64 stopovers made by CIA-operated aircraft at Greek airports and expresses serious concern about the purpose of those flights which came from or were bound for countries linked with extraordinary rendition circuits and the transfer of detainees'.

A recent statement by the Greek section of Amnesty International highlighted the reluctance and inertia which the Greek political and judicial authorities have so far displayed on this subject.

1. Is the Commission satisfied with the measures taken by the Greek Government to fully investigate and account for the flights concerned and to compensate the victims?
2. Does it know whether anyone linked to the Greek Government cooperated with foreign intelligence services with the result that human rights were violated?
3. What measures has the Commission taken, or does it plan to take, in response to the appeals made in the European Parliament's abovementioned resolution?
