## Question for written answer E-004003/2011 to the Commission Rule 117 Emilie Turunen (Verts/ALE)

## Subject: Trainees at the European Commission

Traineeships can provide valuable experience for young people and many studies have shown that a good traineeship helps young people in education to subsequently find a job. In its 2010 'Youth on the Move' flagship initiative, the Commission states that it intends to propose 'a quality framework for traineeships'. In this respect:

- 1. When does the Commission intend to submit its proposal on a quality framework for traineeships? What is the timescale for this proposal and when can we expect it to be implemented?
- 2. The Commission offers 5-month traineeships to graduates, postgraduate students and postgraduates (cf. the information on the Traineeships Office webpage). How many trainees are taken on each year by the Commission under this arrangement?
- 3. Does the Commission take on trainees who are not part of the aforementioned official traineeship scheme? If so, can the Commission say:
- how many trainee posts of this type are offered each year?
- what types of traineeships do these posts cover at the Commission?
- what sort of allowances do such trainees receive, e.g. accommodation, transport, food, daily allowances, etc.
- how long do such traineeships usually last?
- what is the typical level of education of the trainee? Does he/she tend to be a graduate, a postgraduate student or a postgraduate?

In this context, does any regulation or code of conduct already exist on hiring trainees outside of the official scheme.
