Subject: Animal health: EU-wide coordination of research on chronic /visceral botulism

For a number of years now, there have been repeated reports in various scientific journals and in the media to a disease in cattle herds known as chronic or visceral botulism, which allegedly leads to a severe decline in performance and increased mortality. The disease profile of chronic botulism is not clearly defined, but it is thought to be caused by a toxic infection with Clostridium botulinum. There is a great deal of uncertainty surrounding the causes of chronic botulism, its differentiation from other conditions, its diagnosis and treatment.

In the light of the above:

- 1. Does the Commission class botulism as a threat to animal health in the EU? Does it regard this disease as a risk to the health of animals and the food chain?
- 2. Does the Commission plan to gather information on the incidence and causes of botulism in the EU, and is it working to promote coordinated research into the disease?
- 3. Is the Commission considering recognising chronic botulism as an animal disease?
