Subject: Successful integration

The current influx of refugees demands rapid humanitarian action from us. It is very likely that some hundreds of thousands of people arriving from war zones are benefiting from international protection in Europe, which is literally saving their lives. We must, of course, first and foremost help them as people living in Europe.

What medium- and long-term plans are there for the successful integration of these people into European culture?

The consequences of the lack of successful integration in the second and third generations of previous waves of immigrants from other cultures are plain to see. Something must be done about the existing phenomenon, and the possibility of the descendants of today's refugees suffering the same fate must be avoided at all costs.
