Subject: Recognition of psychomotor therapy qualifications in the Union

The framework for the recognition of professional qualifications within the single market is primarily laid down in Directive 2005/36/EC, amended in 2013. However, EU citizens who have gained qualifications in one Member State and wish to pursue their career in another still face obstacles. In October 2015, the Commission published a series of measures to tackle this issue in its strategy to create new opportunities for EU citizens and businesses in the single market.

Psychomotor therapy is one example of a profession for which qualifications are needed, yet whose practitioners still face difficulties when moving between Member States.

1. Has the Commission identified which Member States still do not recognise psychomotor therapy qualifications?
2. How will the Commission improve the current situation?
