Subject: Violent assault on secular values by a migrant in Nice

On the first day of Ramadan, the Muslim holy month in the course of which believers must fast during daylight hours, a young waitress was violently assaulted on a cafe terrace in Nice on the French Riviera.

This deplorable attack was carried out by a migrant, who claimed that the young lady should have been ashamed to serve alcohol during Ramadan and that, if he were God, he would have 'strung her up'. This is by no means a trivial matter and represents an affront to France's republican values at a time of growing religious fundamentalism and an increase in the number of ghetto communities.

The EU is all too willing to promote the 'benefits' of immigration, and is foisting refugee quotas on the Member States, despite the fact that they have failed to cope properly with previous waves of migration. In view of this, what steps does the Commission plan to take to bridge the cultural gap between secular or privately religious Europeans and communities of newly arrived migrants indoctrinated by a religion which believes in a supreme authority above the rule of law?
