Question for written answer E-007171/2016 to the Commission Rule 130 Pilar Ayuso (PPE)

Subject: Data on mercury

In a study commissioned by the Commission in 2010 (BiPro), estimates of mercury stocks in the chloralkali industry were put at between 8 000 and 9 000 tonnes by 2020. In a 2014 study (Cowi, BiPro and Garrigues), that figure was put at 8 400 tonnes, which is in line with the 2010 figure.

However, in a study published on 9 June 2015 (Cowi, BIPRO) the figure is 8 000 tonnes. This is a significant discrepancy, especially given that the studies were written by the same authors.

- 1. Has the Commission looked into the reasons for this major discrepancy in the figures?
- 2. Why is the estimate in the 2015 study that much lower?

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
